I continue to get compliments from our extended family and other researchers about the quality and content of our website.

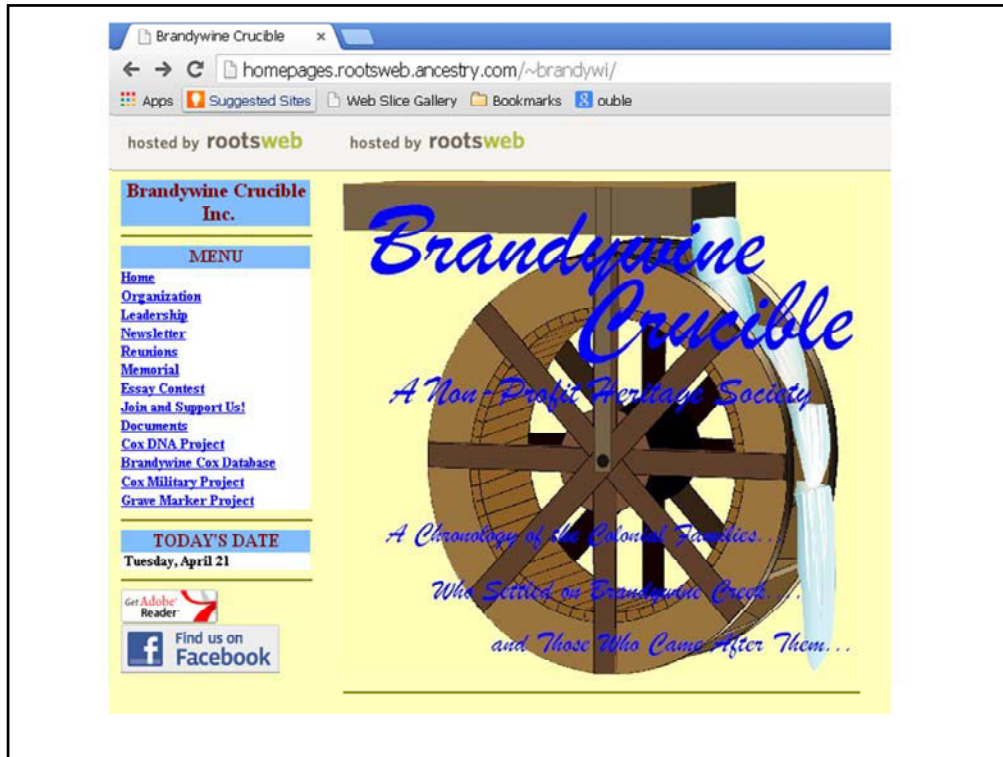

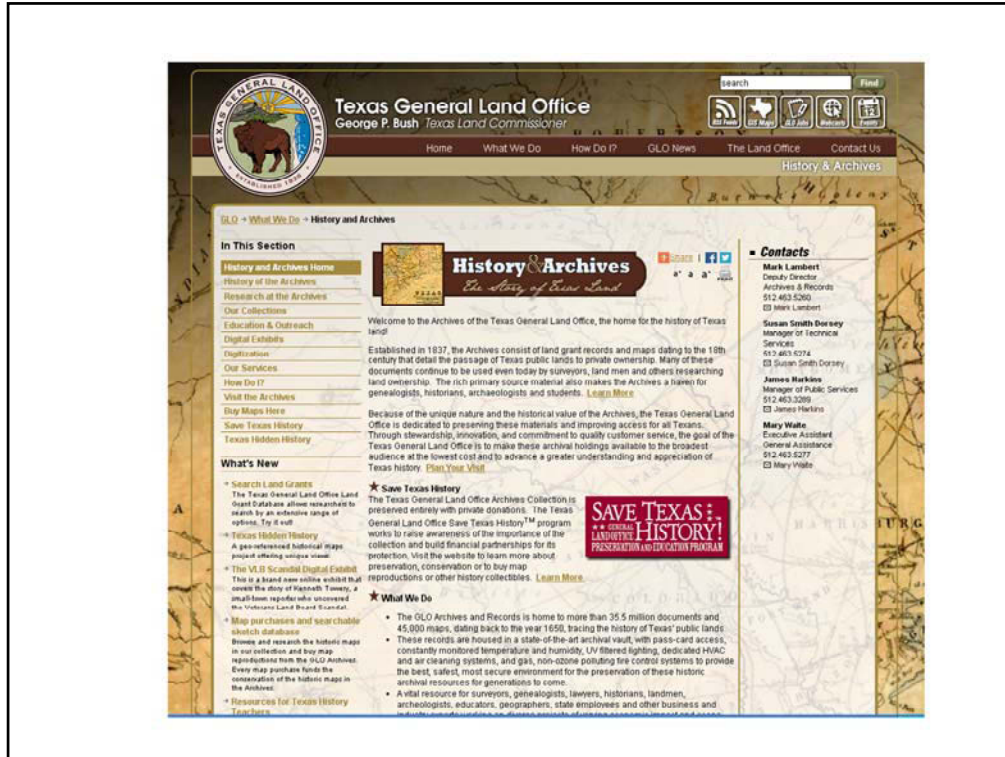
Here they are! Almost 300 documents, available at the click of your mouse. If you click on the hyperlink, a .pdf file of that document opens almost immediately.

For those of you researching your ancestors in Texas, GLO has an incredible amount of unique information. And now, much of it is online. Several years ago I spent many hours at GLO waiting for them to bring me a file, which could not be removed from their office. I also spent many dollars buying maps such as the one hanging on the wall. But now, all that information is on the website for free. Just like ours.

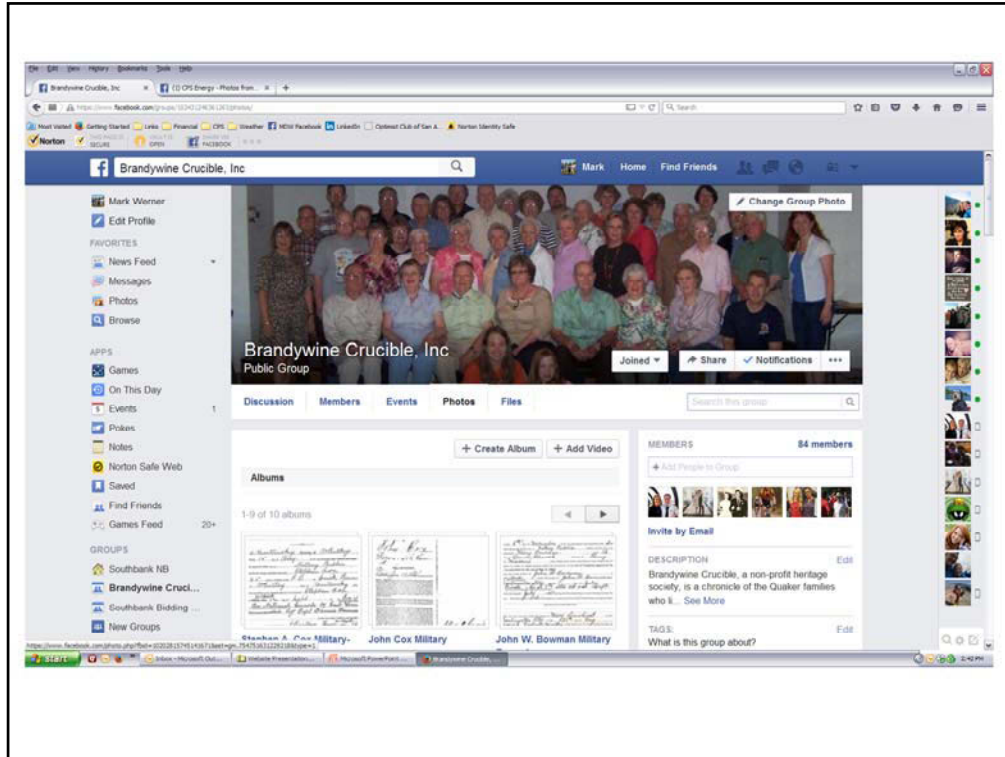
