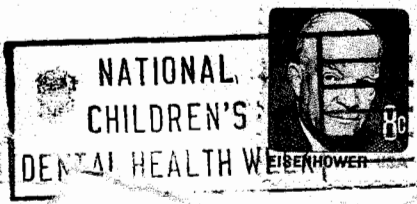
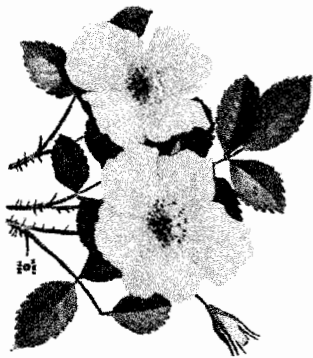

WILD ROSE

The wild roses, of which there are many species, decorate the summer landscape with their fragile showy blossoms. They are important in wildlife management, for their matted bushes along the fence rows often provide shelter to quail and rabbits while their thorny branches give support to the nests of field sparrows and song sparrows. Later in the season, after the froil petals have dropped away, birds eat the red hips and scatter the seeds in other spots. In that way birds and plants work for their mutual survival.
