Killing of Andy Cox near Lacy Creek
in Lamparas, Tex 1890

Bright Hatley being sworn deposes and
says, I knew Andy Cot. Hays, knowing him
for about 25 years He is now dead
He died on the morning of the 21st of Dec
1890. He died I do not know Cot's sin

was shot twice, I come over about
10 o'clock in my car, he heard every thing
was conscious I did not talk to him
at all. He said he was shot said
he wasn't young to die said he wanted
you to face the one who done it
He died about 8 o'clock, I was in
the town of Lampasas on Saturday the 20th
I saw Andy Cot in town I talked with
him, he had an eye trouble
I don't know of it. I have no
idea as to who killed him, I left town
on Saturday Evn about 9-30 o'clock

 and says I knew Andy Cox he
 was my husband I lived in
 Lambasis County State Texas
 We had been married nearly 9
 years. He is dead now. ~~He was~~
~~shot~~ yesterday morning ~~the~~
 1890 He was shot twice. ^{It was} ~~the~~
 I first saw him after he was shot
~~it was down on the creek. My~~
 husband called ~~over~~ when near
 The Creek ~~over~~ called Tom. I
 answered, he was sitting
 up waiting for him. His
 two sisters got to him first
 He said Oh Darling I am shot and
~~my name is Andy Cox. He~~
 was shot over near the 4 mile
 Post. He said there was 6 or 7
 shots fired and maybe more.
 And there was 4 or 5 men and
 maybe more. He said they were
 who done the shooting were right
 on the side of the road in the bushes
 I believe he said the first shot
 hit him. He said as soon as he
 heard the gun crack he knew they

any one, he said "no Mollie I
knew it". He told me he met Coria
Stanley in the PD just after his trial
and he Stanley told him he would
bother The next time he bothered him it
would not be with law.

He said he saw Jake Cox and Louisa

know much to do with one another
He said he left town some time
near eight o'clock and was shot
He said he had a horse and

dressed as well as I remember with
a white coat brown pants and
white hat.

some depositions testify as follows I think
that he was my brother, he is now dead, he
died on the morning of the 21st of Dec. A.D. 1890

He was shot and killed
by and shell found near the shooting
implosion as he was shot with a
bullet which passed through near
lower edge of the right ribs. This ball
passed through the body coming out under
welder. The hand was shot in the back
and that ball did not come out
first saw Andy out the east bank of Lucy
about about 2:40 p.m. I
house I had gone out
found him on the bank of Lucy near
to road side. He says I am shot, I
asked him where he got shot at, He said
near the four mile post etc told me
to go after a Dr. and to get Clark too
that he wanted to see him. I went to town
to Clark and the Dr. Mr. Armstrong and City
some one else. I went up to the
hill near

and a horse gun
I was with me 1897
The ground I called hear it
I sent Dr King out Clark Eastern, Ber
I don't myself come out Together

I was in the town the day he was killed.
I saw Andy there.
I asked him if he was ready to come
out, he said it might be late before
he could get off as he wanted to
come partway with me.
He said he would see me.

says I am working for Paul D Taylor
Ward was Merchant was working
for him on the 20th Dec AD 1890
I was in the store that day I sold
some cartridges to two men who
were unknown to me They asked
if we had any "blue whitters"
in loaded shells I told them no
they bought a pair of Buck shot
I sold them a pair of Winchester
cartridges or exchanged I don't remember
which They took 55 five each
my attention was especially called
to them by the one saying By
God these will kill any thing
I would recognize the spartans if
I should ever see them again

blopped a little and had a new feather

Mr. Armstrong being sworn, he poses
and says I live on Lucas Creek
in Lampasas County, State of Tex
have living in this county for
about 8 years. I knew Andy
Pena for some time. The night
of the 20th or 21st of Nov. I saw him
first down on the Bank of
Lucas Creek near the road.
He was wearing a jacket. He
seemed to be drinking. He said
he would not be in for a bad
fit and asked me what I thought
about it. Then he pulled open his
shirt button and showed me
the bullet hole in or near his
heart. I saw the wound. The
Dr. King I saw he had been
shot 3 times. I think the wounds
(from examination) were made
by a Winchester or larger name
they opinion it was a Winchester.
I assisted in carrying him
from the Creek bank to his home
a distance of 250 or 300 yards.
He was very much excited about it.
I do not know how long he had been
told by the Dr. that he must die

about 8-20 He said "he left town
by himself horse back about 8, Oclo
He said the parties doing the shooting
were on the left of the road coming out from
town, in the bushes.

I being sworn I depose
and say I live in Lampasas
County State of Texas near Lucas
Creek. I recall I recall I had
known him for about 3 years

~~He was at home on Saturday night~~

was at home on Saturday night
the 20th of Dec 1890 Jim Cox came
to my house and told me Andy
was shot and he wanted me
to come and help carry him
up to the house from down
on the creek where he was

lying on the bank near the road
near the creek. He stated he was

near the 4 mile hill when about
3 or 4 spoke as though there might
have been 5 or 6 doing the
shooting. He said they were near
the road on the left coming this
way in the bushes. The first he
heard was the clicking or cracking
of a gun. He said he had for some

time been 8 or 9 October

... given during your murder
after eight by my watch on
the morning of the 21st of Dec
When he died he did groan
the effects of the gun shot wounds

He seemed to be conscious up to between
5 & 6 O'clock I don't know who done the killing
