EARLY COX FAMILIES IN AMERICA

Stanley Cox of Kansas City, Missouri publish ed a book in 1955 titled \square Joseph Cox \square Ancestors and D escendants \square .

He wrote the following:

☐ The Joseph Cox branch of the Cox famiy had its beginning in the United Stated in 1708 when John and

Rachel Cox, lately from England, probably London, were known to be living in New Castle County, Delaware. Shortly thereafter they appeared in the records of the Quaker Meeting in Chester and York Counties, Penn-sylvania. It is thought that this John Cox was a son of Thomas Cox, a wine merchant of London. Thomas

 $Cox \,\square\, s$ Will was probated in 1711 and devised eight hundred acres of land in the vicinity of Philadelp hia to

one of his sons, and five hundred acres on the opposite side of the Delaware River, in New Jersey, to another son. Thomas Cox was known to be a Quaker, and since John, Thomas and Richard were all Quakers,

and their names appeared in the Quaker recprd s of Pennsylvania about this time, it is assumed that they

were the sons of Thomas.

John Cox of Kennett, PA, is named in \square The C ox Family in America \square by Henry Miller Cox, page 249, published 1912. John Cox and his wife, Rachel, had thr ee children as recorded in Quaker records. Apparently there were five more, four of them possibly named Jose ph, Hannah, Jacob and Dinah.

SOLOMON AND NAOMI COX

A Journal written by Jehu Cox in 1877, wh en he was 74 years old, lists fifteen children of John an d Mary Cox;

The youngest was Solomon, born about 174 5 in Warrington, Chester CO PA, son of John Cox, Jr and Mary

HARLAN. Solomon m Naomi (Amy) HUSS EY about 1760 Amy Hussey was b 29 Feb 1742 in Warrington,

PA the daughter of Christopher Hussey, who was b 1716 in New Castle CO, DE d 1774 in Guilford Co NC,

and who married Ann GARRETSON 5 Sep 1 737 in New Castle Co. Amy was 17 years old. Solomon was a

patriot of the Revolution.

Solomon and Amy Hussey Cox moved from Pennsylvania to North Carolina, then to Virginia, Kentucky and

Ohio. They must have lived near Cane Creek, NC, when most of the children were born. (Cane Creek was

renamed Snow Camp by British soldiers who fought the Battles of Cane Creek and Kings Mountain in Oct-ober 1790). Quaker women cared for those wounded in the battles. Amy died in 1818. Solomon □s will dated

The Cox men were among the first to join the Regulators in North Carolina. The first battle of th e Revolution was May 16, 1771 ten miles fro m the Cox family farms. Cox men fought with Governor cessfully led the militia along the Al Tryon who sucamance River against the Regulators. At the next Quake r Meeting the Cox men were disowned because the Q uakers didn □ t believe in fighting. Several of John Cox II sons were included. These skirmishes and the di sowning caused the former Quakers to join the Patriots against the Crown when the War began in 17 75. Whig and Tory troops camped at Cox 🗆 s Mill and se veral Cox families were abused and their homes burn ed by the Tories. By 1779 the devastation caused many Coxes to move to Virginia in Grayson and Carroll Cou nties. The families of Solomon Cox and Christopher Hu ssey Jr. settled along Wilson and Fox Creek branches of the New River, now in western Grayson County. These families related by marriage stayed close and inter married for the next 150 years as they moved through s everal states. The family moved to Virginia and Ohio, Kentucky and Indiana.

Brandywine Crucible, Incorporated

Descendants of Solomon Cox and Naomi Hussey Cox, meeting for a Cox Reunion in Lampasas, Texas formed

Brandywine Crucible, Incorporated in July, 1998 to research and preserve records of the descendants of

Solomon and Amy Hussey Cox. Our English ancestors came to the Colonies where they built flour mills on the

Brandywine River, which flows between Pennsylvania and Delaware. The waterwheel symbol is used on our

stationery, website, and lapel pins. At lea st one of those mills has been preserved on the river.

CHRISTOPHER COX AND HANNAH JOHNSON/JOHNST ON

Christopher Cox was the sixth child and th ird son of Solomon and Amy Cox, born in 1773 in North Carolina

some reseachers say he first married Lydia Carter. About 1799 he married Hannah Johnson/Johnsto Monroe CO, Indiana. Christopher died aged 90 in 1863 in Washington Township, buried in the Littl Baptist Church cemetery, Monroe CO, IN. Hannah was born about 1775 and died in Washington To Brown County, Ind. Christopher was pa wnship, ying taxes with Solomon, William, Thomas and other C Knox Co KY fr 1800-1808 Christophe ox men in r used Cert #73 to apply for 260 acres of land in Knox 24th of July 1801 according t Co, Kentucky o an agreement made 20 December 1800; he would have been about 28 years old. Christopher had an area surveyed in 1805 in Knox Co KY, south of the Gre en River.

Hannah \square s father, Joseph Johnston/Johnson made an application for a pension about 1833 when the government

authorized pensions for veterans of the Revolutionary War. I transcribed that document, written by the County

Judge of Monroe CO in September 1834, dictated by Joseph Johnston/Johnson, because he could not read nor write. The application was signed by David Johnston, Cornelius Cox and William Followell (who made his mark). Cornelius stated he had known Joseph Johnson from infancy \Box I being now about twe nty eight years of age... \Box This means Cornelius was born in 1805, not 1800 as was thought.

Christopher was issued Certificate #5801 d ated the 21st day of September, 1835 by the Land office at Jeff-erson, Monroe CO IN for thirty one acres a nd 34/100th acre of the public lands; the sale authorize d by The Act of Congress the 24th day of April, 1820 and signed for President Andrew Jackson. Christopher would have been forty-seven years old. Christopher appears on the 1830 Census of Monroe Co IN with sons Cornelius and Benjamin and a male 70-80 years old, perhaps this was Hannah \square s father, Joseph Johnson.

My great-aunt, Bettie Cox Helm, confirmed to me that her great-grandmother was Hannah Johnson. KEMP FAMILY RECORD

Huldah Kemp Cox made three trips to Illin ois by wagons from Illinois to Texas during her long lif e. She was

living with Aunt Bettie Cox Helm at Winters at her death 19 January 1947: age 99 years, 9 months and 5 days.

She was quite deaf. Huldah and Jack are buried beside their infant son at Pottsville in Hamilton County.

The north side of that cemetery seems fille d with Kemps.

THE PETERS COLONY

The young Republic of Texas was anxious to settle the lands in north Texas and entered into a contract in 1840

with the Emigration Land Company of Loui sville, Kentucky to promote the settlement and handle t he bringing in of people. The Colony was adv ertised throughout the east and mid-west and Europe. T assigned this task to two brothe he land company rs, W.S. Peters and Henry J. Peters who sent an agent n amed Oliver Hedgecock to Dallas County where, much to the surprise of John Neely Bryan, he set up his agen cy eight miles north of Bryan

s chosen locati on or □his□ city. The □city□ consisted of Bryan□s lea n-to shelter and the small cabin of Joseph Beeman , a distance away. Bryan had married the third of Beem an □ s children, Margaret, 23 Feb 1843 when they rode to Fort Inglish, the present site of Bonham, where an officer could perform the marriage. John Neely Bryan had arrived on the site in 1841; Joseph Be

eman brought his family of ten children in 1842 and built a blockhouse on White Rock creek. The family of John J Cox came the same year. (Who was this John J Cox who arrived in 1842? Was he a relative who sent word back about the good grazing lands?)

In 1843 George Glover brought his family; his children married the Kemps and settled where the Buckner \square s

Children □ s Home now sits. In 1844 more members of the Cox families arrived, including Neely a and, it is believed, Delilah Cox King a nd Katie, nd her husband, John. Many persons were surprised and dismayed to find such a primitive settlement, and some, discouraged, returned to their former homes. Our ancest or Neely Cox was one of those hardy souls wh o stayed, his family spreading in a few years over the s chose land near Elam □s station, tate. Neely Cox first called Markham Is Ferry, on the Trinity River, and was several miles up the river from Bryan □s site. By 1856 the town of Dallas boasted a population of 3000 s ouls, and was on its way to becoming the city we know.

Cornelius $\square\, Neely \,\square\, Cox$ was born abt 1805 in Knox County, Kentucky, the son of Christopher Cox and Hannah

Johnson. He married Catherine JACKSON in Monroe County, Indiana April 1, 1824. Katy Jackson was born

about 1806 in Kentucky, dau of William JA CKSON. Elizabeth Ann \square Bettie \square Cox Helm wrote:

 $\hfill \square$ Neely and Katie became engaged to marry about 1819. When the wedding day arrived the bride , although pregnant,

saddled a horse and rode away, saying, \Box I fooled the fellow \Box . Neely, considered the father of the child, left and was gone

about two years. Andy was born during tho se two years and named Andrew Cornelius. The Cox family refused to associate

with Katie. When Neely returned he and Katie were soon married. She vowed to make him a good wife, and she did. In

January 1824 when she in labor Neely wen t to his mother and asked for help, so she rode to his h ome on the back of his

horse. Twins were born; the baby boy did n ot live. Hannah gave the little girl her own name and placed a string of beads

around her neck. Katie never tried to conc eal these facts from her children, but talked openly about them with her children

and grandchildren.

They had about eight children in Indiana b efore moving to Missouri about 1840, then in 1844 to T exas. Neely

was issued Nacogdoches Third Class Cert. No. 2149 for 610 acres which he patented in Dallas County. He is

listed in the 1850 census for Dallas County , family #217 as a 50 years old farmer with five childre n; born in IN.

(This reference is from The Peters Colony of Texas written by Seymour V Connor, pg 229) The children mar-

ried the neighboring Elam, Bruton and Kem p children. Cornelius Cox and Harvey Cox were chain b earers when

their land was surveyed. Katy died first, then Neely in 1856. Jack told his children he was eleven years old when Neely died of a heart attack as he gathered firewood. He had told his sons to stay on the farm and do chores, but they went with him into the woods where he died. The burial beside Katy is now in the City of Mesquite, the location of the graves lost. Margaret had measles at the time of Neely surial, so Jack was told

to walk her back to the house as she was to o ill to be out, she was eight years old. Jack stood in the yard and

watched his dad □s burial. The older brothe rs and sisters took the young ones into their homes. Be ttie Helm, when visited in 1973, told me Jack was spoiled and lived with the brother or sister he expected to treat him best. A correspondent wrote of finding old scattered grave stones in the area when a road was built years ago. Dallas County has no record of a burial place there. Jack lived with brothers and sisters until he was of age. Neely died without a Will; the Probate Records of Neely □s Estate, which I transcribed, is added to this history.

RECORDS in Dallas County: Cornelius is listed as one who voted in an election held in Dallas County in 1845. He purchased a Poll Tax in 1847. The genealogists in Dallas Public Library referred me to the White

Rock Cemetery in east Dallas as being also known as the Cox Cemetery. The location is hard to fin d, since it is behind (to the west) of some lovely homes on the west side of White Rock lake.

Erma Sanders wrote that C.J. fought at Get tysburg. Jack told his sons that war was terrible, to get water he sometimes drank from canteens of the dead.

C.J. received 26 acres of land in Dallas County after the Probate proceedings were completed for the Estate of Neely Cox. C.J. Cox sold 34.5 acres in the Cornelius Cox Survey to Benjamin F Elam February 1866 according to Dallas County Deed Book J, page 131; he would have been twenty two. Jack and Huldah moved from Dallas Co to Hamilton CO in 1873, then to Comanche CO where he prospered, buying small farms near his own.

After returning to Texas Jack married Huld ah Ann KEMP in her father \square s farmhouse in Dallas Coun

Buckner Orphan Home is on the site of the Kemp Farm. Huldah was born 14 May 1847 in Scott County, IL and came to Texas as a six year old in 1853. Huldah made three trips from Illinois to Texas and back during her long life time. Huldah □s parents, William Maxwell Kemp and Elizabeth Moore Kemp, gave to Huldah

and C.J. Cox 36 acres of land in Dallas Co . in 1868 valued at \$145, also a cow \$10, one mare hors e \$50,

sheep \$5 and a feather bed, bedding and \$5 0 in money. These figures are from a journal kept by Jack, and copied by Winnie Helm Hatley.

Huldah died 19 Feb 1947, age 99 years, 9 months and five days, in the home of Elizabeth A Cox H elm at Wingate, Runnels Co. where she had live d for 25 years.

Bettie Helm wrote a letter to Neva Cox Bowman, daughter of Thomas Fulton \Box Tom \Box Cox in which she described the burial clothing: \Box I am mailing you her wedding gloves, as you are her younges t

granddaughter I hope you wil l like them more than a handkerchief, she had given mo st

all her old things away. We put her away in her wedding dress with a slip, Noma made the

yoke and your mother or Delma made the trimming on the bottom; had lavender gloves.

Mary Atchison gave her a little lavender tie and lavender cap \(\sigma \) she looked sweet, I thought.

----A note in the margin added that the gloves were 81 years old.

----Thanks to Winnie Helm Hatley, Bettie \square s daughter, who shared her mother \square s letter and described the

wedding dress which was saved for the purpose of burial of Huldah:

A beautiful hand stitched dress; small tu cks down the front, gathered, full skirt, fitted bodice. I t still fit her.

She was a very small woman, I doubt she ever weighed over 90 pounds. We all loved her and she did us.

She had a great mind until death. Almost deaf and blind, she still made her own bed, dressed, and combed

her hair. She always had long hair, made it up into a \square do up \square or bun. She liked to churn the but ter. She

smoked a corn cob pipe when a girl, but th ought it was a disgrace for a woman to smoke a cigarett $e.\ \square$

C.J. bought land from his brother-in-law R ichard Bruton and Elizabeth Cox Bruton in Dallas Count y in 1868. The Notary was J. N. Bryan. John Bryan □s wife was Margaret Beeman, a cousin to Huldah Kemp. M argaret helped John lay out the City of Dallas. Jack and Huldah moved out of Dallas County in 1870, so C.J. gave a release to Richard Bruton 21 June 1870 on 260 acres of the Cornelius Cox Survey; Dallas County Deed

Book K, pg 234 R.D. Cox, a grandson, wro te that Jack moved to Hamilton County, and paid a lot of school taxes there. They moved on to Comanche Co in 1881, where he prospered. He owned a general store a nd feed store in the Bibb Community, and bo ught several farms. Jack gave a farm to each child when they married,

and to his grandson, Alton Preston, son of May Belle Cox When Jack died there were three farms left to support Huldah.

[When I was a child, Jack s store was call ed the Store at the Crossroads. We visited a second cousin of Daddy who lived in the east building with his family, and kept the store in the west building. The man was deaf and I was astonished to see my Dad signing, since I did not know he could. This was about 1935

Jack loved to play the fiddle, and played f or dances, but dancing was against Huldah \(\sigma \) s religion a nd she would not go with him to the dances an d he quit going. Calvin Helm was given Jack □s fiddle. Jack told grandson Bernice Helm the reaso n he left Dallas County was because he had become eag er to drink with his old buddies when he wen t into town, and knowing that was wrong, he moved awa y. A story told to Madge Helm Robinson was about Grandpa having some gold after selling something. He would rob him, so they put i was afraid someone t in a little sack and fastened it to little Bettie \(\sigma\) s unde rwear. A pile of cotton was in the field and she pla yed in it and lost the little sack. They searched a long time before it was found. Grandma put it in an old shoe and put the shoe in the smoke house with the hog meat.

Madge Robinson, daughter of Bettie Cox H elm remembered Grandpa \square as the greatest! \square , he liked t o tease her.

Jack died, 17 August 1916 in Energy while hanging wallpaper. He is buried in Pottsville Cemetery, Hamilton

CO. A stillborn son is buried beside him. Jack was seventy two years old. Huldah was buried there 31 years later at age 99.

(they were called Pa and Ma.) \square Ma \square Cotte n was a cousin of Cynthia Ann Parker, \square that girl that got stolen by the Indians and became the mother of Quanah Parker \square .

Will□s parents, Jack and Huldah, gave Will and Georgia 54 acres of land in Comanche County when they married, valued at \$835, also a horse \$40, 4 cows \$60 and \$435 cash, according to Jack Cox□s Led ger now

owned by Winnie Hatley.

Georgia Cox died 24 April 1952 on their 6 2nd wedding anniversary in Abilene, next door to Alice Cox FREE

She was buried in Stag Creek Cemetery in Comanche County, a few miles from the farm where the y lived many years. Will died less than a year later, 2 Mar 1953 in Abilene and was buried beside Georgia at Stag Creek.

Their farm house burned years ago, howe ver several huge trees are left growing beside Hwy 36. Billy Jess and I played under those trees, watching ant lions working in the shallow holes they made. One day we played beside the screened-in front porch and saw a snake under a bush there. Grandmother came calmly out and killed it with a rifle. Their water was gathered from rains into a cistern on the back porch. Grandmother

poured a little kerosene into the cistern to kill any insects, and it only tasted a little strange. They built the

house just west of the home site of Jack and Huldah Cox. A pecan tree stands now in the middle of a field

on the south side of the highway. That tree sprouted from a pecan which was dropped by Jack Cox as he

plowed the field for a crop, snacking from a pocket full of pecans. Aunt Minnie Cox LaRoque told me of

that tree, so I watched for it on trips through the county. For many years a stone-wall protected a well

nearby, the water always cool, even in sum mer.

Will had peach orchards, vineyards of grap es, boysenberries and blackberries, apples, plums, persimmons, pecans, peanuts, sugar cane, and grain for his livestock. He farmed with horses and mules. They had chickens and sold eggs, milked cows and sold milk, raised hogs, too.

Once during a visit I watched Grandmother, Aunt Minnie LaRoque and my mother wash clothes out side the

screened-in back porch. Grandmother gath ered fire wood and placed a black wash pot on top and lit the fire.

While the fire got going the women filled bucket after bucket of water from the cistern on the por ch. Another tub was filled to be the rinse w ater. One woman used a knife to shave a bar of home-m ade lye soap into the heating water. When the c lothes were added, they were swished about with a stick , long since bleached white by the lye. Then the clothe s were lifted out with the stick into the rinse water and swished in it. I do not recall them using a wr inger, they must have twisted the clothes, and hanged t hem on the fence and bushes to dry, there were no clothes lines. The white sheets and such were washed f irst, then printed cottons, then granddad 🗆 s work cl othes. The fire died out and when the water was cooler it was used to wash the

floors of the porch and poured out whereve r Grandmother did not want weeds to grow. This was h ard, back breaking work, smoke was in the air, heat from the fire was making their faces red. This chore was to be done

every week, all year round. Perhaps they used a starch solution on some of the clothes, that I do not recall.

Their elder son, Roy Dean Cox wrote,

We moved to Stephens County in 1900, and back to Comanche Co, to Erath County, where Nealy was

born; to Foard Co in 1910 south of Crowell for two years, back to Comanche. In 1916 my father moved

to Hale Co on the Night Ranch on Running Water Draw for one year, and back to Comanche. (My mother

always wanted to go back to Comanche.) T hey moved to Crosby Co in 1922 for six years, and back to

Comanche Co ...

Earl Ray ROBERTS, a great-grandson, reme mbered that Will always used the phrase \square Bless these comforts... \square when saying grace at meals. Will and Georgia were faithful members of the Church of Christ. Georgia would prepare the unleavened bread for communion using a pizza cutter-like tool to cut it in large pieces. Members would break off pieces as the bread was passed to them. While reading his Bible, Will would move his lips,

almost whispering the words.

When Will came in, he got his rifle and declared that Tom would NOT take the boy from them. L ater, Jack and Huldah gave Alton 43 acres of land in Comanche Co which would have been his m other \(\sigma \) s. May Belle was given a feather bed when she married and \$435 cash.

think you will be mistreated down there, but you should think of the one who has cared for you in days

gone by. You can get all the cotton that yo u want to pick if you want to pick cotton. George has far

more than he can gather and others here al so, you can come back with Pa. I guess if you will but if

you aint ready to come home just let me kn ow when you get ready. Ma may write some. I dont kno w

where she will are not. May, if you wont come home I want you to try to conduct your self so people

cant talk about you. Remember that you are not at Bibb now and the people dont know you as well a

they do here, not that I think that you dont know how to do, but I write this that you may think where

you are and what you are about. Write soon, your brother F.M. Cox

Well, Pony, I want you to come after me as soon as you can. Tell Mother to not grieve about me for I will come back to her if Pa never does speak to me again. Grandma has told me how Mother is

since I came down here. Uncle France want s me to pick cotton for him next week but I dont know what to do; if you cant come before then, I will go to work. The connection and neighbors have vol

unteered to gather Foss \square cotton, I guess I will pick some for him if you dont come after me before

his cotton gets ready to pick It isnt ready yet and wont be for a week yet. Well, as I cant think of any

news to write I guess I better quit. So co me after me as soon as possible. I remain as ever Your loving sister May

 $P.\,S.$ Foster says tell you to bring his dog when you come if it wont be to much trouble to you.

In December, three months after this last letter was written, Tom Preston and May Belle Cox were married in Comanche. Her son in September, and after six days May Belle died.
