The Wedding:

The marriage took place on Sunday May 22, 1921 at 9:00 AM @ before church. by Rev R. T. Howell, Elizabeth Howell Eaton's father. at the J. A. Jackson home in Kempner, Lampasas Co., Texas. [the room was the south bedroom then a parlor or living room].

Reception: a huge dinner.

at the J. A. Jackson home,
Guests: Mathine Turner, All the J. A. Jacksons family, Brother R. T. Howell

[Addie was sick + Mrs. Jahn Cox was in hospital with her]
