FOREWORD

This record of the Cox families has been based on an oral history by my grandfather W.C. "Will" Cox in 1940, on *The Kemps*, written by Bettie Ann Cox Helm, his youngest sister; my uncle Roy D. Cox and his son Elvis Cox of Lubbock, and on information sent me by relatives all over the state and nation. Letters came from Mabel Atchison, Betty Baker of Granbury, Billie Ruth Bell of Weatherford, Zelda Atchison Bennett of Ozona, Nona Blocker, Naomi Brown of Dimmitt, Thomas Sidney Cobb of California, Elbert Lee Cox, Jane Phillips Cox of Virginia, Robert Elden Cox, Nora Cox Drennan of Winnsboro, Blanch Gage of Fort Worth, Louise Gibbs, my Aunt Elsie Cox Gordon, Arlie Gowen of Lubbock, Zona Graves of Stanton, Winnie Helm Hatley of Wingate, Yvonne Johnson of Houston and Austin, Nadine Kelly, Stella Atchison Kelly of Stanton, Thelma King, Melvin Manwarring of Amarillo, Maye McCredie of Washington, Gerald McNabb of San Marcos, Wanda Pennington of Tennessee, Madge Robinson of Wingate, Erma Sanders of Tyler, Erma Smentek, Nadine Atchison Stephens, Delma Streety of Smiley, Ada Cox Stump of OK, Lester Sutton of Florida, Marilyn Swindle of Amarillo, Annie Weavers of Lubbock, Mary Atchison Wilson of Stanton, Jasper and Etha Woodward and Mark Werner.

In tracing the Cox family, I have also received information on the Moore family, the Kemp family, and the Cottens, and have traced other descendants of the brothers of Cornelius Jackson Cox, my great-grandfather.

I have come to share a pride in this vigorous family, summed up be Erma Cox Sanders of Tyler, Texas, who wrote: "The Coxes are great, only stubborn".

Great-aunt Bettie Helm answered questions for me, and her daughter, Winnie Hatley has sent me materials from the Ledger kept by Jack Cox. The first copy of this history goes to Aunt Bettie, I am her namesake.

THE COX NAME

The Cox name can be traced in English records from the time of William the Conqueror, who invaded England in 1066. With his troops was a French knight, Walter Cokkes de Chelworth, called Le Coq. In an account of the family dated 1250 Walter LeCock of Kent County was named a descendant of the original Le Cock. The spelling changed to Le Cockk, and Cokkys, or Kokkes; added to his Christian name: Jeffcock, Willcock, Hancock. A cock was an aggressive, proud bird, and the descriptive word was used by the French of Normandy and the Saxon in the British Isles.

William the Conqueror ordered a census and survey in 1085-1086 of English landowners and their property. The resulting is called the Domes Day Book. Names included are Alvin Cox, a Saxon. Most descendants in the United Kingdom live in the southern and eastern counties, though they are found in all counties.

"The Cox Family in America" was written by Rev. Henry Miller Cox in 1912. The first English colony was in 1607 in Virginia in 1607. A William Cox arrived in 1610 on the ship "Godspeed". Rev. Cox wrote of Cox men in every colony who had emigrated, including our ancestor, Thomas Cox born in 1641. John Cox and wife, Rachel of Kennett, PA are named in this book. They had three children named in Quaker records. The Dallas Library has a copy of this book.

OUR COX FAMILIES

Stanley Cox of Kansas City, Missouri published a book in 1955 titled "Joseph Cox –Ancestors and Descendants". With Gary L Sutton, he wrote the following: "The Joseph Cox branch of the Cox family had its beginning in the United Stated in 1708 when John and Rachel, lately from England, probably London, were known to be living in New Castle County, Delaware. Shortly thereafter they appeared in the records of the Quaker Meeting in Chester and York Counties, Pennsylvania. "It is thought that this John Cox was a son of Thomas Cox, a wine merchant of London. **Thomas Cox's Will** was probated in 1711 and devised eight hundred acres of land in the vicinity of Philadelphia to one of his sons, and five hundred acres on the opposite side of the Delaware River, in New Jersey, to another son. Thomas Cox was known to be a Quaker, and since John, Thomas and Richard were all Quakers, and their names appeared in the Quaker records of Pennsylvania about this time, it is assumed that they were the sons of Thomas."

A Journal written by Jehu Cox and in 1877 when he was 74 years old lists fifteen children of John and Rachel, four possibly named Joseph, Hannah, Jacob and Dinah.

The Journal of Jehu Cox is in the possession of the David A Richardson Family in Salk Lake City. A Quotation reads: "I have two great uncles by the name of Christopher Hussey and Stephen Hussey...Here are come of my cousins, I want work done for them: James Johnson, Alfred Johnson, Sadie Johnson (her work is done). Carnelis Cox and his wife Katy Jackson, William Cox and his wife Lottie Jackson, John King and Delilah Cox his wife." These were all born in the United States, some older than I am and some four years younger. The youngest is 84 now: George Followell and Amy Cox, his wife."

Additional records of the Church of Latter Day Saints, in two different scripts, including Jehu's read: "Jehu Cox attended to the sealing for my grandfather and grandmother, Solomon Cox and Amy Hussey Cox and my father and mother Thomas Cox and Rachel Carr Cox, and my uncle Samuel Cox and Martha Cox; and have been baptised for my brother Solomon Cox, and my uncle Solomon Cox, and uncle Absolom Cox and uncle Christopher Cox and uncle Stephen Cox, and my grandfather Thomas Carr, and uncle Benjamin Carr, and uncle Thomas Carr."

Sealings: Joseph Cox and Amy Baker Cox Thomas Elison and Aled Cox Elison William Wilshan and Michael Cox Isaac Dixon and Rebecky Cox"

Our Garretson ancestors were a Dutch family who settled in New Amsterdam (New York) and would have spelled Cornelius "Carnils".

These quotations are found in Joseph Cox by Stanley M Cox and Gary L Sutton, 1978, pgs 21, 22 and 23.

John Cox, Sr immigrated to William Penn's Colony in Pennsylvania in 1708 with his wife and four sons, assumed to be Richard, Joseph, John Jr, and Thomas, Quakers did not record the daughters. Land records place them in the 'forks of the Brandywine River in Chester, PA., later called Bradford Township.

*Samuel Cox and Hannah had a son, Nathan Cox who married Martha Cox, daughter of Solomon Cox and Amy Hussey Cox in 1847.

John Cox, Jr. married 2) **Mary Harlan** in 1734 in London Grove, PA. after the death of Hannah. They lived in Warrington, Chester Co, PA when their youngest, Solomon, was born. The family moved to Cane Creek, Orange County, North Carolina in 1755 where they were received in Meeting. After the War, they died in Adams Co. PA. Their first two children were born in London Grove.

John Cox was born April 1736, six months after the marriage of his parents, who appeared before the Monthy Meeting to ask forgiveness for their sin, and avoid being removed from fellowship.

Joseph Cox was born 1737.

Dinah Cox was born 1738 in Adams CO, PA m 1759 Finley McGrew 13 Mar 1736.

Naomi (Amy) Cox b 27 November 1739 m John William Wierman

Rebecca Cox was born 1741 m John Blackburn

Mary Cox was born 1743 m Elijah Nickle, February, 1761.

Solomon Cox born @ 1745 in Warrington, Adams CO m Naomi (Amy) Hussey. Solomon Cox was ten years old when they moved to North Carolina in 1745 with other Quaker families to keep their sons from going to war. In 1760 he married Naomi (Amy) Hussey in Cane Creek Monthly Meeting, Orange CO, NC. Amy was born 29 April 1742 in Warrington, PA. Amy died in 1818. Solomon's died in 1820, his Will dated 1819 was filed July 1820 in Eagle Township, Hocking CO, OH. It was witnessed by Solomon Cox, Jr and William Dixon. Warrington Monthly Meeting records: "Solomon Cox's wife requests certificate to New Garden, NC and children (except one) cert. from Cane Creek NC. 8-12-1780, but as they are being removed from it is thought best to send it back to that Meeting." Another entry: "Solomon Cox and family and Christopher Hussey are to be visited again, some part of their conduct not consistent with our Principles.

SOLOMON AND NAOMI COX

Solomon married Naomi (Amy) Hussey when she was seventeen years old in Cane Creek MM in Guilford CO, NC in 1766. Amy was born 29 Feb 1742 in Warrington, PA, the daughter of Christopher Hussey and Ann Garretson, b 1716 in New Castle CO, Delaware. Solomon was a patriot of the Revolution.

Most of their children were born near Cane Creek. British soldiers renamed it Snow Camp, after the battle of King's Mountain. Quaker women cared for the wounded in the battles. After the war they moved to Virginia, Kentucky and Ohio. Amy died there in 1818; Solomon's Will dated 1819 was filed July 1820 in Eagle Township, Hocking CO, OH. It was witnessed by Solomon Cox, Jr and William Dixon. A copy of his Will follows.

Children of Solomon and Amy Cox, all born in Orange CO, NC:

Martha, twin b 29 January 1761 m @1778 Samuel Cox, her first cousin, son of her Uncle Samuel Cox and Hannah Wierman Cox, b 1754. Martha and Samuel and her father were 'disowned by Cane Creek MM 'marrying out of unity to her first Cousin'; her father for letting it happen. Their defence: they did not share grandmothers. They moved with the families to Virginia, then in 1805 to Knox CO, KY, which became part of Whitley CO in 1818. Samuel died there in 1832. Martha moved with son Nathan to Livingston CO, MO @ 1842 and died 9 Mar 1845.

Solomon Cox, twin, b 29 January 1761 m 1) 1788 Martha Dixon; m 2) 23 Aug 1812 Mary Williams; m 3) Temperance HENDRICKS 20 DEC 1831; he died @1850 in Livingston CO MO.

Mary Cox b 1763 m Mr. Mahan/Mahon died when her tenth child was born.

Christopher Hussey b before 18 Feb 1598/99 Dorking, Surrey, England d 7 Mar 1684/85 Hampton, NH m bef 1635 Theodate BACHILOR b abt 1610 in Wherwell, Hampshire, England Theodate d 8 Aug 1649 in Hampton, NH She was dau of Stephen Bachilor b abt 1561 in England, m abt 1590 and his wife, Anne. Stephen d Oct 1656 in London, England

Christopher Hussey b abt 1716 New Castle Co DE d 1774 Guilford CO NC m 5 Sep 1737 Anne GARRETSON in Hockessin, New Castle CO DE Anne was b abt 1720, d 1801 in Alamance CO NC. Her parents were Casper/Casperius Garretson b 1676 in New Castle CO, died there before 3 Dec 1726, and Ann Cox daughter of William Cox b 1695 in England. Casper was a son of John GERRITSON JAN DER HOF b abt 1650 in Gilderland, Holland, the family immigrated to New Amsterdam (New York) and the surrounding area. Through the years the name changed to Garrettson and other various spellings.

Naomi (Amy) Hussey, born 1742 in PA, daughter of Christopher Hussey and Anne Garretson Hussey married Solomon Cox in 1760.

Warrington Monthly Meeting in 1759 appointed William Nevers for an overseer in the place of Christopher Hussey who was moving to North Carolina. There seventeen-year-old Amy, his daughter, would marry Solomon Cox in 1760 in Cane Creek MM.

They returned to York County: Warrington MM reported, "Amy Hussey produced certificate from Cane Creek dated 12-6-1778."

The American Revolution

The Cox men were among the first to join the Regulators in North Carolina. The first battle of the Revolution was May 16, 1771 ten miles from the Cox family farms. Cox men fought with Governor Tryon who successfully led the militia along the Alamance River against the Regulators. At the next Quaker Monthly Meeting the Cox men were "disowned" because the Quakers did not believe in fighting. Several of John Cox II sons were included. These skirmishes and the disowning caused the former Quakers to join the Patriots against the Crown when the War began in 1775. Whig and Tory troops camped at Cox's Mill and several Cox families were abused and their homes burned at the Tories. By 1779 the devastation caused many Coxes to move to Virginia in Grayson and Carroll Counties.

The families of Solomon Cox and Christopher Hussey settled along Wilson and Fox Creek branches of the New River, now in western Grayson County. These families related by marriage stayed close and intermarried for the next 150 years as they moved through several states, Virginia, Ohio, Kentucky and Indiana.

CHRISTOPHER COX AND HANNAH JOHNSON/JOHNSTON

Christopher Cox was the sixth child and third son of Solomon and Amy Cox, born in 1773 in North Carolina. (He may have first married Lydia Carter.) About 1799 he married Hannah Johnson/Johnston in Monroe CO, Indiana. Christopher were paying taxes with Solomon, William, Thomas and other Cox men in Knox CO, KY from 1800-1808. He used Cert. #73 to apply for 260 acres of land in Knox CO the 24th day July 1801, according to an agreement made 20 December 1800; he would have been 28 years old. He had an area surveyed in 1805 in Knox CO south of the Green River.

Christopher was issued Cert. #5801 dated the 21st day of September, 1835 by the Land Office in Jefferson, Monroe CO, Indiana for thirty one acres ad 34/100th acre of the public lands; the sale authorized by the Act of Congress the 24th day of April, 1820, and signed for President Andrew Jackson. Christopher would have been forty-seven years old.

Census: 1830 Monroe County, Indiana: Christopher is listed with sons Cornelius and Benjamin and a male 70-80 years old. This may have been Hannah's father, Joseph Johnson. Christopher died aged 90 in 1863 in Washington Township, Brown County, Indiana, is buried in the Little Union Baptist Church cemetery, Monroe CO, IN. Hannah was born about 1775 and died in Washington Township,

Hannah's father, Joseph Johnston/Johnson made an application for a pension about 1833 when the government authorized pensions for veterans of the Revolutionary War. I transcribed that document, written by the County Judge of Monroe CO in September 1834, dictated by Joseph Johnston/Johnson, because he could not read nor write. The application was signed by David Johnston, Cornelius Cox and William Followell (who made his mark). Cornelius stated he had known Joseph Johnson from infancy 'I being now about twenty eight years of age...' means Cornelius was born in 1805, not 1800 as was thought.

Christopher died aged 90 in 1863 in Washington Township, Brown County, Indiana, buried in the Little Union Baptist Church cemetery, Monroe CO, IN. Hannah had also died in Washington Township.

My great-aunt, Bettie Cox Helm, confirmed to me that her great-grandmother was Hannah Johnson.

CORNELIUS "Neely" COX

Cornelius 'Neely' Cox was born abt 1805/06 in Knox County, Kentucky, the son of Christopher Cox and Hannah Johnson. He married Catherine JACKSON in Monroe County, Indiana April 1, 1824. Katy Jackson was born about 1806 in Kentucky, dau of William JACKSON. Granddaddy Will Cox had talked with me, Uncle Bud has written in his work, and another relative told me that Neely and Katy were married in 1824. But the birthday of their first son Andrew (Uncle Andy) was 1822. I wrote to Aunt Bettie Helm about it. She wrote back: "I don't know how you found out about Uncle Andy, but Papa told us when we were grown that Uncle Andy belonged to Katy before they married, about two years." She also wrote the story following:

'Neely and Katie became engaged to marry about 1819. When the wedding day arrived the bride, although pregnant, saddled a horse and rode away, saying, 'I fooled the fellow'. Neely, considered the father of the child, left and was gone about two years. Andy was born during those two years and named Andrew Cornelius. The Cox family refused to associate with Katie. When Neely returned, he and Katie were soon married. She vowed to make him a good wife, and she did. In January 1824 when she in labor Neely went to his mother and asked for help, so she rode to his home on the back of his horse. Twins were born; the baby boy did not live. Hannah gave the little girl her own name and placed a string of beads around her neck. Katie never tried to conceal these facts from her children, but talked openly about them with her children and grandchildren.'

MARRIAGE Book A, pgs 30-31 Monroe County, Indiana License issued March 31st 1824: 'This is to certify that (I) joined together in Matrimony Cornelius Cox and Catherine Jackson on the 1st of April, 1824 William HARDIN, Jus P (Seal)'

They had about eight children in Indiana before moving to Missouri about 1840, then in 1844 to Texas. Neely was issued Nacogdoches Third Class Cert. No. 2149 for 610 acres which he patented in Dallas County. He is listed in the **1850 census** for Dallas County, family #217 as a 50 years old farmer with five children; born in IN.

(This reference is from The Peters Colony of Texas written by Seymour V Connor, pg 229)

The Cox children married the neighboring Elam, Bruton and Kemp children. Cornelius Cox and Harvey Cox were chain bearers when their land was surveyed. Katy died first, then Neely in 1856. Jack told his children he was eleven years old when Neely died of a heart attack as he gathered firewood. He had told his sons to stay on the farm and do chores, but they went with him into the woods where he died. The burial beside Katy is now in the City of Mesquite, the location of the graves lost. Margaret had measles at the time of Neely's burial, so Jack was told to walk her back to the house as she was too ill to be out, she was eight years old. Jack stood in the yard and watched his dad's burial. The older brothers and sisters took the young ones into their homes. Bettie Helm, when visited in 1973, told me Jack was spoiled and lived with the brother or sister he expected to treat him best. A correspondent wrote of finding old scattered grave stones in the area when a road was built years ago. Dallas County has no record of a burial place there. Jack lived with brothers and sisters until he was of age. Neely died without a Will; the Probate Records of Neely's Estate, which I transcribed, is added to this history.

RECORDS in Dallas County: Cornelius is listed as one who voted in an election held in Dallas County in 1845. He purchased a Poll Tax in 1847. The genealogists in Dallas Public Library referred me to the White Rock Cemetery in east Dallas as being also known as the Cox Cemetery. The location is hard to find, since it is behind (to the west) of some lovely homes on the west side of White Rock lake.

No connection has been found with Wm. B. Cox and our line; he was relative of Lula Cox Moore, wife of Hartwell Moore. W.M. Kemp was the husband of Elizabeth Ann Moore, parents of Huldah Ann Kemp, wife of C J Cox.

George m 24 Dec 1868 Mary Ann 'Mollie' TUCKER in Madison Co Mississippi. *The Census* of 1900 reported George Henry lived in Comanche CO with his daughter, Viola, on a farm next to the farm of his son, Will and family. George Henry owned his farm and Will and Fannie rented theirs. In 1900 George rode horse- back to Fisher CO and bought 35 acres of brush covered land. He returned to Comanche CO and moved his family to Fisher Co. His son, Robert Elden Cox, was born three months later. Vess and Viola were not married yet. George Henry and Vess opened a butcher shop in McCaulley, Will M T Cox did the cattle buying until a fire destroyed the shop about 1905. They became farmers again, caring for Viola and her children when her gambling husband wandered off. George Henry d Dec 1909 months after suffering a stroke at McCauley, Fisher Co; no gravestone His death certificate states he died of paralysis of the throat. His grand daughter Josephine TINNEY

wrote he had a severe stroke and just lay there and never moved until he died. George Henry was a Civil War Veteren, a member of 6th Cavalry, Ross Brigade.

The young Republic of Texas was anxious to settle the lands in north Texas and entered into a contract in 1840 with the Emigration Land Company of Louisville, Kentucky to promote the settlements and handle the bringing in of people. The Colony was advertised throughout the east and mid-west and Europe. The land company assigned this task to two brothers, W. S. Peters and Henry J Peters who sent an agent named Oliver Hedgcock to Dallas County, where much to the surprise of John Neely Bryan, he set up his agency eight miles north of Bryan's chosen location of "his' city. Bryan's city consisted of Bryan's lean-to shelter and the small cabin of Joseph Beeman, a distance away. Bryan had married the third of Beeman's children, Margaret 23 February 1843 when they rode to Fort Inglish, the present site of Bonham, so an officer could perform the marriage. Margaret helped John lay out their city. A replica of their house sits on the Dallas courthouse lawn. John Neely Bryan had arrived on the site in 1841, Beeman brought his family of ten children in 1842 and built a blockhouse on White Rock. The family of John J Cox came the same year. No relationship has been established with John J.

In 1843 George Glover brought his family by wagon-trains with other families from Illinois. Kemps settled where the Buckner's Children's Home now sits. In 1844 more members of the Cox family arrived, including Neely and Katie, and it is believed Delilah Cox King and her husband, John King. Many were dismayed to find a primative settlement, and returned discouraged to their former homes. Our ancester Neely Cox was a hardy soul who stayed, his family spreading in a few years over the state. Neely Cox chose land near Elam's Station, first called Markham's Ferry on the Trinity River, several miles up the river from Bryan's site. By 1856 the town boasted a population of 3000 souls, and was on the way to becoming the city we know.

MOORES/HUNNICUTTS/ KEMPS/COXE

When I sat down with Grandfather Will Cox, to talk about family, he clasped his hands on his knee and began to recite, he knew it all by heart. Thus began my grandfather when telling our Story:

"Elizabeth Ann Moore married William Maxwell Kemp in 1843"

To get to that event, we will begin with the **Hunnicutt family** who lived in Cumberland CO, North Carolina.

A HUNNICUTT married a MOORE who married a KEMP who married a COX...and here we are.

Hartwell Taylor Hunnicutt was born 7 April 1780 in North Carolina. He is described as a 'real mover'. He lived in two counties in North Carolina, two counties in South Carolina: (Greenville, where he found a wife, **Margaret CUNNINGHAM**) and Anderson (called the Pendleton District). He lived in two counties in Illinois: Madison and Greene CO, where he died 6 March 1832, buried in Hunnicutt Cemetery. He was a farmer, a teacher and a miller. Margaret Cunningham was born 30 March 1783 at Greenville, SC. Margaret bore him 15 children.

Hartwell's daughter, **Huldah Ann Hunnicutt** was born 27 Sept 1803 in South Carolina m **William B. Moore** 23 Jul 1821.

William B Moore was born 9 June 1797 in Orangeburgh District, SC d 22 November 1846 Scott CO III. Their children:

Sara Jane Moore b 10 Mar 1834 Scott CO, d 18 Aug 1834 buried at Bloomfield Cemetery Ill.

Francis Marion Moore b 1835 in Scott CO m Mary M Vickers 15 Jan 1857. Mary died Apr 23, 1859 after giving birth to their son, William Thomas Moore, who was taken by his grandmother Hulda Ann Kemp. F M died 23 Jan 1863 in Civil War. When the Kemps joined the wagon train for Texas, Hulda Kemp, a widow, brought the infant boy with her family.

Infant Moore, 23 Jan 1838, stillborn, but Bloomfield Illinois cemetery.

William Joseph Moore b 3 Mar 1846 Scott CO. His father had died the 22nd of November. Wm. J. narrued 18 May 1865 in Scott CO m Lucinda Slagle. d 26 Sept 1926, bur Rutledge Cemetery, Scott CO III.

Elizabeth Ann Moore, b 5 Dec 1825 at Green CO, Ill, the second child, married William Maxwell Kemp in Wilson CO, Tennessee 23 April 1843 in Scott CO Ill. She died in Dallas CO. TX 9 February 1917. William M Kemp was born 22 Mar 1822. in Wilson CO, TN, he died 5 December 1911. William and Elizabeth are buried at Pottsville cemetery. Their first three children were born in Illinois, the younger ones in Texas. They came by wagon-train from Illinois with other families which settled as neighbors and as they grew to adulthood intermarried. They settled on land now in the City of Mesquite. Two streets are named for early settlers: Elam Road and Bruton road. These are the children:

William Murphy Kemp, first son of William and Elizabeth was b 9 Nov 1844, m 11 November 1866 Margaret Cox, daughter of Neely and Katy Cox. W. M. died 5 October 1925, buried at Pecan Wells.

Huldah Ann Kemp b 14 May 1847, married 21 June 1866 <u>Cornelius Jackson "Jack" Cox.</u>, son of Neely and Katy Cox. She died 19 February 1947 in Winters, TX, buried in Pottsville Cemetery in Hamilton CO, TX. Age 99 yrs, 9 months, 5 days. She made five wagon-train trips between Illinois and Texas during her long life.

Mary Jane Kemp b 160 August 1849, m John Martin GLOVER, died in childbirth in 1869, buried in Dallas CO, buried probably in Glover Cemetery. Those three children of W.M. Kemp and Elizabeth Kemp were born in Illinois.

<u>Melissa Margaret Kemp</u> was born 5 May 1852, m James Hardy GLOVER., brother of John Glover, buried Pottsville.

Sarah Elizabeth Kemp was born 21 April 1855 m Cornelius "Bud' HAVENS, buried Pecan Wells.

CORNELIUS JACKSON "JACK' COX

CORNELIUS JACKSON 'JACK' COX, son of Cornelius 'Neely' Cox and Catherine 'Katy' Jackson was born 22 July 1844 in Missouri and brought to Texas in 1845 by his parents with others in a wagon train. Jack was the tenth child, the eighth son, only his sister Margaret was younger. Both parents were dead by 1856; his mother was buried on the family farm, or the nearby Elam cemetery, which no longer exists, the graves lost. Jack watched the burial of his father from the yard of the home, his sister Margaret indoors with measles.

This receipt is in the Dallas County files, Cornelius (Jack) would have been eighteen years old.

Civil War Record

C.J. Cox joined the 6th Texas Cavalry, Ross Brigade in Rockwall 15 Sep 1862 to fight in the Army of the Confederate States of America. Copies of Muster Rolls are dated through 1863. Notes on the Rolls read: 'Detached duty in charge of horses'; 'absent, left with slow train'; 'Not paid'; 'Absent: on det (detached) service since May 19, 1864'; 'Horse unserviceable'.

Report of Col. B.W. Stone 6th Tex Cavalry CSA Hdq. Oliver's Store ARK Mar. 12 1862:

Action near Pea Ridge, Elkhorn Arkansas: 'especially grateful to Maj. L.S. Ross for his coolness in intrepidity...'

Report of Gen. Earl Van Dorn, Commanding Trans-Miss. Dist Des Arc, ARK Apr 14, 1862:

"Praise of Ross, who led scouting party; cut off USA train; dispatched Ross to Van Dorn, took 70 prisoners."

Letter to Col. Coates, Commander U.S. Force from L.S. Ross, Brig.-Gen. C.S.A. Mar 4, 1864:

'Protests execution of two men of 6^{th} Reg. Tex. Cav.' Letters demand unconditional surrender of USA 'Refused at Yahoo City'

Operations against USA in Marion County, AL Texas 6th left Tuscaloosa on 19th of April 1864 under Lt. Col. Ross. C.J.'s name appears on <u>a Roll of Prisoners of War of Companies of 6th Regiment Texas Cavalry</u>, Confederate States Army, commanded by Col. Jack Wharton; surrendered at Citronelle, Ala., by Lieut. Gen. R. Taylor, C.S.A. to Maj Gen. E.R.S. Canby, USA, May 4, 1865, and paroled at Jackson, Miss. May 13, 1865. Roll call dated Jackson, Miss. May_____, 1865. CJ was 21 years old.

[These reports were printed in a major work ordered by President Grant, *The War of the Rebellion, Official* Records of the Union and the Confederate Armies. These huge volumes are filled with communications by both armies, in the Cornett Library at WTA&M University in Canyon, TX]

Erma Sanders wrote that C.J. fought at Gettysburg. Jack told his sons that war was terrible, to get water he sometimes drank from canteens of the dead.

C.J. received 26 acres of land in Dallas County after the Probate proceedings were completed for the Estate of Neely Cox. C.J. Cox sold 34.5 acres in the Cornelius Cox Survey to Benjamin F Elam 9 February 1866 according to Dallas County Deed Book J, page 131; he would have been twenty two.

After returning to Texas Jack married Huldah Ann KEMP in her father's farmhouse in Dallas County 21 June 1866. The marriage is recorded in Dallas County in Vol. C pg 309. Winnie obtained a certified copy of the marriage license from Dallas County. The license was issued to Jackson Cox and Huldah Kemp. 'Jack' is often the nickname for John, and a close examination reads that the minister, J.W. Pinson, Gospel Minister wrote 'I united *John* Cox and Huldah Kemp....'.

William Maxwell Kemp and Elizabeth Moore Kemp gave Huldah and CJ Cox 36 acres of land in Dallas County in 1868, valued at \$145, also a cow \$10, one mare horse \$50, sheep \$5, and a feather bed, bedding and \$50 in money. Huldah Ann Kemp was born 14 May, 1847in Scott County, Illinois. The family joined a wagon train coming to Texas in 1853, leaving relatives behind in Illinois. Huldah made five from Illinois to Texas and back during her long life time. These figures are from a Journal kept by Jack, and copied by Winnie Helm Hatley.

Also in 1868 CJ bought land from his brother-in-law Richard Bruton and Elizabeth Cox Bruton in Dallas CO.

the Notary was J N Bryan whose wife was Margaret Beeman, a cousin of Huldah Kemp Cox. Margaret helped John Neely Bryan lay out 'his city' of Dallas.

In 1870 Jack and Huldah moved out of Dallas County, so CJ gave a release to Richard Bruton 21 June 1870 on 260 acres on the Cornelius Cox Survey, an inheritance to Jack. Dallas County Deed Book K, pg 234.

R D Cox, a grandson wrote that Jack moved to Hamilton County and paid a lot of school taxes there. They moved again to Comanche County and bought several farms. Jack and Huldah gave each child a farm when they married, and to his grandson, Alton Preston, whose mother was May Belle Cox Preston. When Jack died there were three farms left to support Huldah.

This story about Jack and Huldah was retold about their life after moving from Dallas County to Hamilton. In September 1873 Jack told Huldah he must ride to Dallas to sign papers on the sale of land there, and she asked

him not to go as a child was soon to be born. He asked a sister to stay with Huldah and he built an Indian-style birthing hut in the yard, we can only imagine it. The baby was born during heavy rains, so Huldah returned to the house in deep mud. Jack started back from Dallas during the rains and met a man about a half day's journey of Hamilton County and asked him of news. The man told him a woman had died in childbirth, he didn't know her name. Jack rode the horse almost to death to get home. He jumped from the horse with tears on his face. Huldah received him with no sympathy for his fear. "It serves you right to be frightened!" The child was Francis Marion Cox, born 27 September 1873, he was called "Pony" all his life, because as a toddler Jack said he looked like a fat, little Indian pony.

LAND RECORDS FOR CORNELIUS JACKSON COX IN COMANCHE COUNTY

The State of Texas in 1871 set apart School Lands in Lampasas and Comanche Counties for sale under direction of the County Judge of Lampasas County. A statement dated 27 August 1906 made by Lampasas County Judge M M White listed names of those who had bought the lands and verified that deeds should be honored. Jack Cox began buying land in 1884, these are some of the transactions. Ref: *Bibb Community* by Chapman

1884 4 Feb/ C J Cox bought 160 acres in Block 32 of the Lampasas School Land (P:476) first granted to William Downing 15 Jan 1881 after the survey made in 1879 William Rudd. Acres price was \$1.00 with 10% interest. Post Office receipts indicate that C J sent annual payments to the Lampasas County Judge.

1885 C J Cox sold Block 32 to R A Drennan, and bought back 70 acres of the South Part (P:468, R:55) There are four possible sites for the merchantile store in Bibb within these acres.

1885 C J Cox was granted 131 acres on 13 June, joining the SW corner of Lampasas County Three-League School Land. (6:333).

1891 C J Cox *transferred* 50 acres of the 70 to John Atchison "For \$1.00 and love and affection for my daughter Evelyne." (Ref:32:185) John and Evie had married 25 September 1886 in Comanche County.

1894 C J Cox bought a 152 yd x 160 yd lot from L J and Abbey Sweeden, which was part of the land transferred to John Atchison in 1891. There must be a story behind that. John and Evie may had moved to Stanton and sold the Comanche County property to Sweeden.

1894 18 December. C J Cox bought two town lots #4 and #5 in Bibb. Block #4 from Thomas J and R C Vaughan (36:293). The lots faced South Main Street. C J and/or F M Cox owned a one-acre lot located further south in Block 23, just north of the Baptist and Methodist Churches. C J and his children may have owned other lots.

1895 C J Cox bought a half acre in Block 23 on South Main Street of the town site from J W Beattie (34:358). Ownership had gone from A J Whitaker to W C Jackson, to James W Beattie to C J Cox. It could have been the location of the C J Cox and Son store in the 1890s.

1899/1900 C J Cox was paying taxes on the 160 acres J H Miller Survey and 348 acres S E McAsham Survey located far down in the south part of Comanche County, five acres in the Lampasas County School Land, and two town lots in Bibb.

Researchers: James and Donna Chapman

In an interview by J R Eanes which was published in the *Comanche Chief* July 16, 1943, Will Cox of Sidney, (my grandfather) recalled the merchantile store in Bibb from 1894-1897. When I was a child about 1935 we visited "the Crossroads Store" southwest of Will's farm. A second cousin of my dad, Nealy Cox, lived in the east building with his family, and kept the store in the west building. Winnie Hatley wrote that our relatives the Moore family once ran the Cross Roads store. James Chapman wrote in his book, "*Bibb Community*" that Elmer LaRoque and family ran a general store at the Cross Roads.

Bettie Cox Helm was her mother's youngest child, and her family loved Huldah dearly. Winnie shared a room with her and retold some of the stories of Jack. He loved to play the fiddle at dances, but dancing was against Huldah's religion and she would not go with him so he quit going. Calvin Helm was given his fiddle. Jack Cox told his grandson Bernice Helm the reason he left Dallas County was because he had become eager to drink with his buddies when he went to town, it was wrong for him so he moved away.

A story told to Madge Helm Robinson, a daughter of Bettie Helm, was about when Grandpa have some gold coins after selling something. He was afraid someone would rob him, so they put it in a little sack and fastened it to little Bettie's underwear. A pile of cotton was in the field and she played in it and lost the little sack. They

searched a long time before finding it. Grandma put it in an old shoe and put the shoe in the smoke house with the hog meat. Madge remembered Grandpa 'as the greatest!', he liked to tease her.

The Cox family gathered yearly at Wingate for her birthday party after she was 90. Around 1945/46 there were about 300 direct descendants in attendance. Huldah died 19 Feb 1947, age 99 years, 9 months and five days. She was buried in her handmade wedding dress in Pottsville Cemetery beside Jack and their infant son.

Bettie Helm wrote a letter to Neva Cox Bowman, daughter of Thomas Fulton 'Tom' Cox in which she described the burial clothing: "I am mailing you her wedding gloves, as you are her youngest granddaughter I hope you will like them more than a handkerchief, she had given most all her old things away. We put her away in her wedding dress with a slip, Noma made the yoke and your mother or Delma made the trimming on the bottom; she had lavender gloves. Mary Atchison gave her a little lavender tie and lavender cap—she looked sweet, I thought. She had \$200. worth of flowers or more."

----A note in the margin added that the gloves were 81 years old.

Thanks to Winnie Helm Hatley, Bettie's daughter, who shared her mother's letter and described the wedding dress which was saved for the burial of Huldah: 'A beautiful hand stitched dress; small tucks down the front, gathered, full skirt, fitted bodice. It still fit her. She was a very small woman, I doubt she ever weighed over 90 pounds. We all loved her and she did us. She had a great mind until death. Almost deaf and blind, she still made her own bed, dressed, and combed her hair. She always had long hair, made it up into a 'do up' (bun.) She liked to churn the butter. She smoked a corn cob pipe when a girl, but thought it was a disgrace for a woman to smoke a cigarette.'

Cornelius Jackson Cox died 17 August 1916 in Energy while hanging wallpaper. He was seventy-two years old. He is buried in Pottsville Cemetery, Hamilton County. An infant son is beside him. Huldah was buried there 31 years later at the age of 99.

These records of the children of Evelyn Cox and John Atchison were sent by their granddaughters, and concludes my information on their family.

WILLIAM CORNELIUS COX, second child of Jack and Huldah Cox, was born 2 Jan 1869 on a farm in Dallas CO. Will married Georgia Ann COTTEN on 24 Apr 1890; she was born 16 Nov 1871 in Coryell County, a few miles west of McGregor, the daughter of Joab Harris COTTEN and Leah Elizabeth CRYER Bennett Cotten, 'Ma' Cotten was a cousin of Cynthia Ann Parker, 'that girl that got stole' by the Indians and became the mother of Quanah Parker'. Will Cox and Georgia Cotten Cox were my grandparents.

Will's parents, Jack and Huldah Cox, gave Will and Georgia 54 acres of land in Comanche County when they married, valued at \$835, also a horse \$40, 4 cows \$60 and \$435 cash, according to Jack Cox's Ledger now owned by Winnie Hatley.

Georgia Cox died 24 April 1952 on their 62nd wedding anniversary in Abilene, next door to Alice Cox FREE. Services were held in Abilene before she was taken to Stag Creek cemetery in Comanche County where she was buried, a few miles from their farm. Will died less than a year later, 2 Mar 1953 in Abilene and was buried beside Georgia.

Their farm house stood north of the road, with a little creek behind it. The family had built the house which burned years ago, however several huge trees are left growing beside Hwy 36. Billy Jess and I played under those trees, watching ant lions working in the shallow holes they made. One day we played beside the screened-in front porch and saw a snake under a bush there. Grandmother came calmly out and killed it with a rifle. Their rain water was gathered into a cistern on the back porch. Grandmother poured a little kerosene into the cistern to kill any insects, and it only tasted a little strange. They built the house just west of the home site of Jack and Huldah Cox. A pecan tree stands now in the middle of a field on the south side of the highway. That tree sprouted from a pecan which was dropped by Jack Cox as he plowed the field for a crop, snacking from a pocket full of pecans. Aunt Minnie Cox LaRoque told me of that tree, so I watched for it on trips through the county. For many years a stonewall protected a well nearby, the water always cool, even in summer.

Will had peach orchards, vineyards of grapes, boysenberries and blackberries, apples, plums, persimmons, pecans, peanuts, sugar cane, and grain for his livestock. He farmed with horses and mules.

During a visit I watched Grandmother, Aunt Minnie LaRoque and my mother wash clothes outside east of the screened-in back porch. Grandmother gathered fire wood and placed a black wash pot on top and lit the fire. While the fire got going the women filled bucket after bucket of water from the cistern on the porch. Another tub was filled to be the rinse water. One woman used a knife to shave a bar of home-made lye soap into the heating water. When the clothes were added, they were swished about with a stick, long since bleached white by the lye. Then the clothes were lifted out with the stick into the rinse water and swished in it. I do not recall them using a wringer, they must have twisted the clothes, and hanged them on the fence and bushes to dry, there were no clothes lines. The white sheets and such were washed first, then printed cottons, then granddad's work clothes. The fire died out and when the water was cooler it was used to wash the floors of the porch, the seats in the outhouse, and poured out wherever Grandmother did not want weeds to grow. This was hard, back breaking work, smoke was in the air, heat from the fire was making their faces red. This chore was to be done every week, all year round. Perhaps they used a starch solution on some of the clothes, that I do not recall.

Their elder son, Roy Dean Cox wrote, "We moved to Stephens County in 1900, and back to Comanche Co, to Erath County, where Nealy was born; to Foard Co in 1910 south of Crowell for two years, back to Comanche. In 1916 my father moved to Hale CO on the Night (sec) Ranch on Running Water Draw for one year, and back to Comanche. (My mother always wanted to go back to Comanche.) They moved to Crosby CO in 1922 for six years, and back to Comanche Co."

Earl Ray ROBERTS, a great-grandson, remembered that Will always used the phrase 'Bless these comforts...' when saying grace at meals. Will and Georgia were faithful members of the Church of Christ. Georgia would prepare the unleavened bread for communion using a pizza cutter-like tool to cut it in large pieces. Members would break off pieces as the bread was passed to them. While reading his Bible, Will would move his lips, perhaps whispering the words.

Will and Georgia had five children and raised Alton PRESTON, son of Will's sister May Belle Cox Preston, who died six days after his birth. Those five children were:

It was perfectly sensible to him to hit me in the head. I have a special love for that cousin, even

Uncle Bud began writing letters to Cox people about 1965, bought the Stanley Cox book, and was beginning a genealogy when he died. His son, Elvis, brought me his papers, which have been valuable. Alice Jaynes m 2) Frank FREE in Abilene in 1930. Frank, a barber who died in 1958, was buried in Abilene. Her parents, Will and Georgia Cox, moved from the Bibb farm into the house next door to them in Abilene. In the spring of 1952 Grandmother Georgia fell and broke a bone in her shoulder, the attached muscle pulled the fragment down into the upper arm causing great pain but she refused to go to a hospital. My husband, H E Wallace, and I visited her in the tiny shotgun house in south Abilene while she lay abed. She died 24 April, 1952.

Alice Free <u>m 3)</u> B.J. 'Bige' COX of Sidney, Comanche CO, TX. Bige was not related, but known since childhood. Alice was buried in Abilene 1961 beside Frank Free.

WILLIAM CORNELIUS 'NEALY' COX, JR fourth child and younger son of Will and Georgia Cox b July 20 1902 near Harpersville in Erath Co. His oldest sister, Minnie LaRoque Weathersby wrote: 'Mama was having asthma bad after Allie was born. Dr. Carson of Indian Gap advised Papa to take her to a higher dryer country. Well, a friend of ours, Mr. Jack KEEL, had a farm for sale in Erath Co. seven miles from Harpersville, so Papa bought it. We moved to it in December 1896. Nealy was born there." The family later returned to Bibb.

Nealy finished school in Bibb and may have attended a college in Brownwood for a semester. About 1916 Will was farming in the Running Water community in Hale County and Nealy worked at the Coca-Cola plant in Plainvew. He moved to Amarillo and attended San Jacinto Barber College; bought a two-chair barber shop north of the drug store in Goodnight, Armstrong CO. Nealy met and married Maud NEWBERRY 10 May 1925 in Goodnight at the home of her parents, Jesse Eli Newberry and Della MATTHEWS NEWBERRY. Nealy bought a house from a Mr. Small, which was across the street from the post office/drug store, and I was born in it. My brother, Billy Jess, was born in the house of our grandmother, Della Matthews Newberry. She had moved into Goodnight from the section house west of town after the murder of Jesse in 1926. Nealy moved his barber shop to the Clarendon-Amarillo highway north of the railway station and used the east side of the building as a Sinclair Service Station and bus stop. In 1934 a new paved highway was planned from Amarillo to Clarendon on the south of the tracks. Daddy bought a small acreage from Mr. Pat McDowell on the south side of the planned highway, and moved his shop/station and a repair shop on it. A well had to be dug, a tower and water tank in place; the 'cow shed' moved; fencing for the cow lot. Hard work.

He also bought a house on the northeast side of Goodnight and had it moved near his shop. Mother and I stood in the pantry looking through an east window to watch the house being moved slowly south and then over the railway tracks to the new site. Daddy and mother set about making it livable. It had a living room, dining room and kitchen on the east, three bedrooms on the west, nice front porch; screened in back porch, no bath room. Water was piped to the kitchen sink, and into the barber shop. Daddy built outhouses behind his shop for ladies and gentlemen as I watched.

Once the house was on its foundation, Mother and Daddy began repairs. Daddy wallpapered the house, sanded floors and varnished them. Mother painted woodwork. Soon it smelled new inside. The next summer we painted the outside, that is, Billy and I helped a little. We spent Christmas of 1934 in that house, and I recall a visit by mother's grandmother Malinda Ray Matthews and her daughter Vinnie Matthews Cox. Her husband may not have been related to our Coxes. They came from Compton, CA.

In 1936 Nealy closed the barber shop and began working for McDonald Auto Parts in Amarillo, traveling through the panhandle and into New Mexico selling auto parts to garages and auto dealers. He left in darkness on Monday morning and came home Friday night. The best day of the week was when Daddy came home!

In January 1937 (Bill says it was March) we moved to Canyon, renting a three story brick house at <u>2406 7th</u> Ave. There was a clear view of Old Main building at West Texas State Teachers College from our windows. In May we watched the Class of 1937 walk in cap and gowns on 4th avenue and up the front steps. There were no houses between fourth and seventh avenues.

How can I describe my mother? She went nowhere alone, she avoided going out. Our move to Canyon meant that I, at 9 years old, did the errands: to the bank, post office, grocers. She gave me our Report Cards and sent us to the West Texas State Teachers College Demonstration School. I led Billy into the office of Dr. Savage, the Principal and told him we had come to enroll, so he asked where my daddy was. He did not believe I had come

alone, but went out into the hall, looked out the doors. He was gracious and walked up across the hall and east to Mrs. Sliger's 2nd grade classroom and he introduced us. I was instructed to come back there after school to walk home with Billy. Since 4th to 7th grades were on the second floor, Dr. Savage led me upstairs to Mrs. Jean Moore's classroom where 4th grade was in Geography class. Mrs. Moore directed a freckled redhead to go with me to math class. When the bell rang her freckled nose went up and she was gone! Beatrice Clark kindly asked me to follow her. I last saw freckled face in 2002 and her nose went up in the air! (Sixty five years of snobbery.) Ha!

We lived in the brick house a few months before moving to 1807 2nd Avenue for about three years. Our rent for the four bedroom house was \$12.00 a month. My cousin Buddy Cox lived with us one semester to play basketball.

In 1940 Daddy hired two carpenters, brothers-in-law Elwood Shero and Poe Cabe, to go to Goodnight and tear down the house and use the lumber to build a house at <u>2106 7th Avenue</u>. We moved into it on 4 April, 1940, a light rain was falling.

Mother was asking my cousins to call her Aunt Margaret, not Maud. (A poet had written a poem about the lovely milkmaid named Maud, that made the name undignified, vulgar -Latin meaning common.)

It was about this time that Daddy and Uncle Pete--mother's brother, J E Newberry, Jr,-- bought a farm on the southeast edge of Hereford in Deaf Smith CO.30 miles west of Canyon. It was about 190 acres, with good soil and a well. It was called the Cox and Newberry Farm, and years later, Bill and I became owners of it. A long story there.

Daddy grew ill from stomach ulcers and agreed to having surgery in Scott and White Hospital in Temple. He was so afraid of being put to sleep. He stopped breathing during surgery, though they got him breathing again, he never woke up. He died of pneunmonia a week later, 11 November, 1952, he was fifty, I was eight months pregnant with my first daughter. His services were in the Church of Christ in Canyon, his burial in Dreamland Cemetery.

Mother died of congestive heart failure 19 Aug 1984 in Amarillo, Potter CO. age 83, buried 21 Aug 1984.

Bettye Ruth Cox b [] Goodnight, Armstrong CO, started school there and transferred to the Demonstration School at West Texas State Teachers College where she graduated in 1944, then earned a BS in Art and Secondary Education, Class of 1947. I was hired by Portales schools to teach English in the Sixth Grade and art in first through sixth grades in a Ward school. I had met Hardy Elbern Wallace of Happy while in college, he joined the Navy in 1945. He came to Texas on leave after the death of his grandfather Wallace in early May, 1948. I resigned my job and we married 12 May 1948 in Canyon. H.E. was b 28 Nov 1927 in Ralls, Crosby CO, son of Hardy Addis "H.A." Wallace and Vera Estelle WILLARD WALLACE of Ralls. We caught a train in Clovis, NM to Oakland, CA.

Wally reported our marriage and we were assigned Apartment #77 in Eniwetok Naval Housing in Concord, CA, about five miles south of Port Chicago on the Sacramento River. Concord was a pleasant town surrounded by wheat fields and orchards. In July he was transferred to Hunters Point Naval Shipyard in San Francisco on the Bay. He caught a ride to work and said I should find a way to move our things there: A trunk and two or three suitcases were all we had. The wives of the Village told me to go to a lumber yard where a man and a stake-bed pickup could be hired to move me. Thank goodness, the driver knew where he was going; across the long bridges and left down the Bay shore line. That apartment was about 100 feet up from the shore line, our view across the Bay to the cities east of us, ships slipping by, planes landing on the water; streets and steep hills were to the west. And near by, Oriental men harvesting oysters with a small boat near a shack.

He was discharged on his birthday, [], 1948 as an Electronics Technician II. We took a bus to Los Angeles where we visited his mother, Estelle Willard KREIMER and husband Norman Kreimer in Glendale before coming by train to Amarillo, met by Judge Wallace and his wife, Ernestine Wilson Wallace.

Judge Wallace was County Judge of Swisher County, and had found us an apartment in Tulia. I had a job waiting as a fifth grade teacher in the Tulia School, spring semester. I did not teach again.

While in Tulia we attended and joined the Methodist Church and found friendship, fellowship and joy in knowing the Lord. Our "Young Married Class" included ex-service men and their new wives.

The Wallaces had lived in Happy where H A was superintendant of Schools, and where Wally graduated in 1944. Mr. Thomas Leonard Fore owned a Ford dealership there, and had recently bought the dealership in Tulia. Mr Fore met Wally on the sidewalk outside of the First National Bank in Tulia and asked Wally to work as a bookkeeper and assistant parts manager in Tulia. A job! In June Mr. Fore fired the parts manager for theft, and Wally became the parts manager and asked me to became the bookkeeper. I loved accounting. In 1956 H.E. became a partner with Edward Flaherty when they bought the Happy dealership from Mr. Fore's sons. We moved to Happy about the first of September. After a year or so he bought Edward's share and named it Wallace Motor Company.

Our three daughters were all born in Swisher Memorial Hospital in Tulia.

In October 1986, after thirty years at Happy, we moved the dealership to Dimmitt, and in June of 1987 we bought a house at 716 Pine St. in Dimmitt. Wally died 9 Sep 1990 of multiple myeloma. After services at First United Methodist Church in Dimmitt, he was buried in Happy Cemetery. Happy friends hosted a reception in the FUMC of Happy following the interment.

Ford Motor Company named me as Dealer a few months after Wally became ill. He made an agreement with Mr. J R Brown to buy a 49% interest, and I would be the senior partner. The offer equaled about 5% of the total assets, I did not argue about it. My partnership with Mr. Brown ended in March 1992 when our cash flow was 1/3 of the daily expenses and Mr. Brown was in hospital with gout. So ended my short time as a Ford Dealer. We sold the assets at auction and I was left with an empty building. The Duckwall Company of Kansas made a contract with me to lease it, and put an ALCO Store there, then extended the lease for 22 years. I was so grateful to have it leased.

A note about my own life. I moved from Canyon to Portales, New Mexico about 29th of August, 1947. Forty seven years later, after many adventures I moved from Dimmitt back to Canyon. I bought a house at 1606 7th ave. Three times I lived on that street, each house with the '6' number. Now, in 2020, I'm in a retirement community.

MAY BELLE COX second daughter, fifth child of Jack Cox and Huldah Kemp Cox, was born 21 Dec 1875 in McGirk, Hamilton CO, m Tom G PRESTON 19 Dec 1894 in Comanche May Belle died 23 Sept 1895, six days after the birth of her son, Alton Preston She was buried at Stag Creek cemetery in northwest Comanche CO. There was much anger in the family toward Tom before the marriage, and Tom did not call a doctor to help her deliver the child. Jack and Hulda paid for a doctor who saw May too late to save her, and paid for her burial. Will and Georgia took Alton when he was two days old into their home and the story is told that one day Tom appeared there and told Georgia that he would return to get Alton. When Will came in, he got his rifle and declared that Tom would NOT take the boy from them. Later, Jack and Huldah gave Alton 43 acres of land in Comanche Co which would have been his mother's. May Belle was given a feather bed when she married and \$435 cash.

Some letters were found in an old trunk and copied by Willie Helm Hatley.

A Letter to T.G. Preston from May Cox:

Bibb Comanche Co TX 18 April 1893

Mr. T.G. Preston

Dear Friend it is with pleasure I seat my self to answer your kind and welcome letter which I received the 15. Well Tom you asked me to not use your name in mine and Johnnies trouble. You need not be a feard of that I would die before I would tell her what you have told about her to me I guess we are done with our troubles Any how I dont intend to say any thing to her if she dont to me This is the first time I was ever in any thing of the kind, and I would not have been in this if some one had not told some lies on me and I have caught the one that has told them, it is Rhoda Cotten. Well Tom, there was a dance at Mr. George Atchisons last night and I could of went if I had wanted to but I didnt want to go if I cant go to a dance when you are here, I will not go when you not here.

Pony and Tobe went but me and George stayed at home. You must write to me as soon as you get this and let me know how you got home and if the folks knew you when you got there. Well I will have to close but I could write all day and then not tell you all I want to I would have given any thing to get to talk to you before you went I think you might have brought my horse to me before you left. Well good by my love May Cox

A letter to May Cox from her brother, F. M. (Pony):

Womack Bosque Co TX 1 Oct 1893

Miss May Cox

Dear sister It is with pleasure I take my seat to write you a few lines. I am well and hoping these few lines will find you and all of the folks well I went to church this morning Two pretty young girls came home with Mr. Whiteley, I can hardley write for listening at them talk, but John was listening. I thought I would write some. I have been picking about 250 pounds of cotton a day. I went to the Gap last Saturday and came back Sunday. Esther said she wanted to see all the people mighty bad. Dick Drennan is at work over at the Gap. He said he dont know when he would come home and I dont know when I will come. Mr. Whiteley thinks he will make about 20 bales of cotton and we have picked six. I promised to help him as long as I could make wages. I guess John told all that I could. I was glad to hear from you, May. If you get out of envelopes you can git 10 cents out of my trunk some where. Write Soon and tell me all the news. John talks like he wants me to finish this letter, he is complaining with his arm. I am making about a dollar a day but it takes about all of it to keep me in clothes and horse feed. What is Rhoda and Lottie doing? Tell them hello. Well I will close, asking you to write. Tell Bettie I wish I was there to quarrel with her.

F.M.Cox

Excuse me for this time and I will try to write more next time.

A letter to May Cox from F.M. Cox

31st August 1894:

Miss May Cox

Dear sister I will indever to answer your kind letter which I received some time a go, was glad to hear that you was well. This leaves us all as well as comon. I would have answered your letter before now but Grandpa [Kemp] is hear and if nothing hapens Pa will take them down there to morrow and I will send it by them. Aunt

Mollie was buried the 21, George and Berdy Atchison got back on the 28. Tom Preston and the girls left here the next Monday after you left and Green Preston and family went with them and Tom come back with them. They came back on the 17th and Tom left again last Saturday. Homer Atchison has not come back yet and if he was here you know I would tell him what you said to tell him. I think so much of Homer any way, I expect if you want Homer told any thing you will have to get some one else to tell him, or tell him your self. There was a dance at Mr. Armstrongs last Friday night. I didnt hear of it till next day, therefore I did not go. Don't expect I would have goneif I had of heard of it. Well, I expect grandpa can tell more to you than I can write. Tell Foster I would like to go a fishing but havent the time at present. I expect we will go to picking cotton nextweek. If no body turns up I will go to Bibb Sunday to preaching, and every thing. You know that it is foot washing day You art to be here to go. Well, May probly I will have a dance about the 28 of next month. At least I have thought something about it. You had better try to come home before then or you may miss something. If some of the folks from down there dont come up so you can come home, you can let me know and I will try and come after you. Write and tell me where you will come are not so I will know what to do. I want you to come home if you will, and I know Mother wants you to come home. I think you can live at home all right and think it best for you to come home. Not that I think you will be mistreated down there, but you should think of the one who has cared for you in days gone by. You can get all the cotton that you want to pick if you want to pick cotton. George has far more than he can gather and others here also, you can come back with Pa. I guess if you will but if you aint ready to come home just let me know when you get ready. Ma may write some. I dont know where she will are not. May, if you wont come home I want you to try to conduct your self so people cant talk about you. Remember that you are not at Bibb now and the people dont know you as well as they do here, not that I think that you dont know how to do, but I write this that you may think where you are and what you are about.

Write soon, your brother F.M. Cox

Huldah wrote on the back of Pony's letter (May had troubles with Grandpa Jack over Tom Preston. Huldah's letter indicates that May was staying with Foster Kemp, Huldah's brother in Hamilton Co.)

September 1 1894

Dear child, I set my self to drop you a few lines to let you know how we are getting a long, we are all up but I am not well, have not been for a week. Will's children have the whooping cough. Well, May, I want you to come home, for I think that is the best for you, and I dont think it would be treating meright for you to stay. I did not think that you want to stay when you left and if you stay it will be against my will. I want you to study and see if you think it is doing me right. I will close. We have just heard that Foss was bad and Pap and Mother and your Pa will start down in the morning. I must go to baking something for them to eat. From your Mother

May Belle's answer to Pony about coming back home:

McGirk TX September 6, 1894

Dear brother, will at last endever to write to you a few lines in answer to the letter which you sent me by Grandpa [Kemp] I was glad to hear from you and to hear that you was well, this leaves me as well as comon and I hope that it will find you all well. Pony I wrote a letter to send by Pa but he wouldnt speak to me and therefore I didnt ask him to take it. Well, Pony, I want you to come after me as soon as you can. Tell Mother to not grieve about me for I will come back to her if Pa never does speak to me again. Grandma has told me how Mother is taking every thing to heart and I cant stand it. Tell her, though, I have been in the best of company since I came down here. Uncle France wants me to pick cotton for him next week but I dont know what to do; if you cant come before then, I will go to work. The connection and neighbors have volunteered to gather Foss' cotton, I guess I will pick some for him if you dont come after me before his cotton gets ready to pick It isnt ready yet and wont be for a week yet. Well, as I cant think of anynews to write I guess I better quit. So come after me as soon as possible. I remain as ever Your loving sister May

P.S. Foster says tell you to bring his dog when you come if it wont be to much trouble to you.

In December, three months after this last letter was written, Tom Preston and May Belle Cox were married in Comanche. Her son Alton Preston was born 17 September, May Belle died after six days. She is buried in Stag Creek Cemetery.

Anne Merle Cox REED studied the Census Records for birth states reported:

Will Cox reported: Father born: Indiana Mother born: Illinois Georgia Cotten reported " " Louisiana " " Louisiana Lottie Cotten reported " " Mississippi " " Louisiana

Georgia and Lottie did not agree on birth state of their father.

Minnie Weathersby, Will's eldest daughter, wrote of her grandfather Cotten, 'My grandfather was an Indian fighter, fought on up to the Great Divide. Indians shot an arrow through the calf of his leg into his horse and there was a big scar. I don't know where he was born; he got some medals for bravery and is buried at Indian Gap in Comanche County. My grandmother Elizabeth was born in Baton Rouge, LA; her cousin was Cynthia Ann Parker, the girl stolen by the Indians."

Annie Weavers, daughter of Pony Cox wrote "Joab Harris Cotten was a wonderful grandfather. He was a blacksmith. I've always understood that he was part Indian and he really looked the part. [Comment: Several family members wrote that J H was part Indian, but there are no brown eyed descendants. My test for DNA geneaology showed no native American genes. ??]

J.H. Cotten applied for a Civil War pension and sent a doctor's letter testifying that Joab could no longer work as a blacksmith, 'He had a bullet in his heel which caused him pain; received the wound at the Battle of Shiloh.' Joab made the application at the age of 72, and had worked in spite of the pain for many years. He was awarded Pension 22491. He died in 1910. ["Don't ever be lazy."]

THE STORY OF THE RING

Lew Cotten gave his mother, Elizabeth Cotten a gold ring before 1900 at Bibb, TX. His name was engraved inside it. One day in Gap Elizabeth visited the Kilgores and was helping dig fresh potatoes. As she finished she slung the dirt off her hands, the ring went with the dirt and could not be found.

In the 1950s the place was owned by Era and Dave Auvenshine who found the ring. They gave it to Minnie Cox LaRoque, a granddaughter of Elizabeth Cotten. It had been lost 51 years. The ring was passed on to Lorene LaRoque Foster, and then to Lisa Foster, her daughter-in-law, in 1983. Lorene kept a journal of the Cox and Cotten families.

CORNELIUS COX'S PROBATE RECORDS

Cornelius 'Neely' Cox died in the fall of 1856 on his farm in Dallas County without a will, so the County Court dealt with his relatives and others in settling the estate. These records were filmed by the Dallas Genealogical Society in 1977. Photocopies of the microfiches are hard to read, so some of the words are illegible. They were written by pen and ink, some were folded and the county judge or the clerk made notes of approval or filing on the backs of them. I have numbered each entry. Spellings are copied. My explanations are bracketed [] 'Do' means 'ditto', 'Dec'd' means 'deceased', 'Clk' means 'Clerk', f'ng means 'following'

THE WILL OF SOLOMON COX Hocking County, Ohio 1819

In 1810 Ross County, Ohio and Athens County, Ohio gave up land to form Hocking County, Ohio. A Solomon Cox and a Jacob Cox appeared in the 1818 tax list of Hocking County, according to 'Early Ohio Tax Records' by Esther Waygandt Powell.

Solomon Cox wrote his Will 9 September 1819 at Eagle Township, according to Hocking County Deed Book A, page 1. The records, transcribed from Ross County Deed Book of 1818 read:

"In the name of God, Amen. I, Solomon Cox, late of Hocking County and State of Ohio, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, being weak of body but sound and perfect mind an memory, blessed by Almighty God for the same, do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following: That is to say, first I give and bequeath unto my eldest daughter Martha Cox the sum of one dollar which is her full share of my estate with what she hath already had. I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Cox and her heirs one dollar which is their full share of my estate with what she and they hath already had. I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Ann Perkins one dollar which is her full share with what she already hath. I also give and bequeath unto my son Absolom Cox one dollar which is his full share of my estate with what he already hath. I also give and bequeath unto my son Christopher Cox one dollar which is his full share with what he hath already had. And I also give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Cox one dollar which is his full share with what he already had. I also give and bequeath unto my son Stephen Cox one dollar which is his full share with what he hath already had. I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Amy Mahan one dollar which is her full share with what she already hath. And as to all the residue and remainder of my estate, goods and chattels of what kind and nature what soever it may be to be equally divided between my loving wife Amy Cox and my son Solomon Cox, share and share alike and what live stock there may be the same to keep or dispose of at their election. And lastly I do appoint my son Solomon Cox and William Dixon, sole executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made.

"In witness whereof I have herewith set my hand and seal this ninth day of Septemer in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.

Solomon Cox"

The Will was probated in Hocking County in July 1820, according to county records.

The Probate read: "To all to whom these present shall come, Greetings:

Know ye that John Thompson, president and Benj. Beadle and Abraham Bitcher, Esquires, associate judges of the Court of Common Pleas of said County at the Courthouse at Logan, in session on the 3rd day of July, AD 1820.

The last Will and testament of Solomon Cox, late of said County, deceased, was proved by Nicholas Cox and Alexander Graves, two of the subscribing witnesses thereto, and is now proved and approved by us, and the said deceased, while living, and at this death, was possessed of goods and chattels and credits within this State by means whereof the goods and chattels and credits, and also the auditing and allowing and finally adjusting the accounts, the administrations of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of said deceased, any way concerning his will is granted unto Solomon Cox and William Dixon named in said will, they being first so sworn, will and faithfully to administer the same by first paying the debts and then the legacy contained in said will so far as the property will thereunto extend, or Law direct, and make a true inventory of all the said goods, chattels and make a true account thereof when so required.

"In testimony hereof, we on the day and year aforementioned, have caused the Seal of our said Court to be hereunto affixed and order these present to be attested.

"In witness hereof, I, Royal Converse, Clerk of said Court, have set my hand this $3^{\rm rd}$ day of July AD 1820 Royal Converse, Clerk.

An inventory of the goods and chattels of Solomon Cox was made by the appraisors Appointed by the Court, John Ratcliff, Jessie Ratcliff and Ezekiel Ratcliff. A listing of the goods was attached; the total value was \$318 dollars and 62.5 cents. The Executors made an accounting of debts due to the estate and cash on hand, a total of \$96.50

which flows between Pennsylvania and Delaware. The waterwheel symbol is used on our stationery, website and lapel pins. A watermill is preserved on the river, perhaps it is one built by our ancestors.
