JOHN HUSSEY, JUNIOR got certificate to New Garden Monthly Meeting, North Carolina 10th month 20th day 1759.

Produced a certificate from Cane Creek, North Carolina 3rd month 10th day 1764, dated 2nd month 4th day 1764.

JOHN HUSSEY, called John of Newbury. Married about 1733. died in York Co., Penna. 1770. Named his son, among others, John of New Garden, living in North Carolina. His wife was named Margaret (Riccord?). Received on certificate from Newark Monthly Meeting 4th month 15th day 1751 at Warrington.

JOHN HUSSEY born 1st month 18th day 1675, died 1733; married (2nd) at Newark Monthly Meeting (intention) 2nd month 3rd day 1702/3 Ann Inskeep, daughter of John and Sarah Inskeep of Burlington, N. J. (New Castle County, Delaware Wills, p. 30; Newark MI. Minutes.)

JOHN HUSSEY, baptized 2.28.1635; d. 1733; married 9/2/1659 Rebecca Perkins, daughter of Isaac and Susanna Perkins of New Hampshire. Went to New Castle, Delaware by certificate from Dover New Hampshire Monthly Meeting dated 3rd month 18th day 1723. He bought land there 1695. Representative 1696.

- 1 JOHN HUSSEY married 12-5-1596 Mary Wood. He was supposed to have been cast away upon Cape Florida and there devoured by native cannibals. (Location of Cape Florida not given.)

- 2 CHRISTOPHER HUSSEY baptized Dorking, Eng. 2/18/1599. Married Theodate Batchelder Came on William & Francis arriving at Lynn, Mass. 6/5/1632. He died 3/6/1685/6 aged about 90. Was called Captain. Served in Provincial Militia.

Theodate Batchelder, born 1588, was daughter of Rev. Stephen Batchelder by his first wife, née Bate (?).

- 3 STEPHEN HUSSEY baptized Lynn, Mass. 12/31/1635. Nantucket records state he was born at Lynn, Mass. 1630. If Christopher Hussey, his father, did not come to Lynn until 6/5/1632, that year would have been the earliest he could have been born there. He married Martha Bunker October 8, 1676.
Brother of John I, m. Rebecca Perkins
Martha Bunker, wife of Stephen Hussey, was born 1656 daughter of George Bunker and Jane Godfrey.

- 4 BATCHELDER HUSSEY married Abigail Halle (also spelled Hale), October 11, 1704. Moved with part of his family of sons to Winter Harbor or Biddeford, Maine. He settled at Fletcher's Neck 1737. Lived for a while at Dover, N. H. Place of death not known. Will does not mention a son Christopher. Does mention John as oldest son, and son Stephen.

Abigail Hall, wife of Batchelder Hussey, was born 2nd month 24, 1680, daughter of John Hall of Dover's Neck, N.H. and his wife, Abigail Roberts, who were married 11/3/1671.

- 5 CHRISTOPHER HUSSEY was born at Nantucket 2nd month 16, 1706. At some time before his marriage he moved to Delaware for he married Ann Garretson of New Castle County, Delaware at Hockessin Meeting, Penna. He is called of New Castle Co., Delaware in their marriage record on file at Kennett Meeting.
On 5-3-1750 he received on certificate at Cane Creek Meeting, North Carolina. Ann Garretson was daughter of Casper Garretson and his wife, Ann. No date of birth given.

STEPHEN HUSSEY was born 1730 (complete date not given) per Nantucket Vital records. On 9-3-1762 he married Married Martha Chamness at Cane Creek Monthly Meeting. He was called of Orange County, No. Car. in marriage record. On 7-1-1809 he and his family was granted certificate to Fairfield Monthly Meeting in Ohio. He died 3-9-1812 and was buried at East Fork, Ohio.

Martha Chamness, wife of Stephen Hussey, was born 11-11-1746/7 in Frederick County, Maryland, daughter of Anthony Chamness and his wife, Sarah Cole. Anthony Chamness was born in Smithfield, London about 2nd month 1713, son of John Chamness and his wife, Ann. Sarah Cole was daughter of Joseph Cole and his wife, Susannah, of Baltimore County, Maryland. She died 12-9-1830. Was buried at East Fork, Ohio.

CHRISTOPHER HUSSEY was probably born in Cane Creek, North Carolina. On 6-3-1793 a Christopher Hussey was dismissed from this meeting for marrying out of unity. This would mean that Sarah Brown was not a member of Society of Friends. He was received back again for on 9-3-1808 he was granted a certificate to Fairfield Monthly Meeting, Ohio. He was received there 4-29-1809. Name spelled HUZZA. On 6-29-1815 Christopher Hussey, son of Stephen and Martha Hussey, was married at Newbury Meeting House to Rachel Graham, daughter of Jacob and Ann Jackson of Clinton County, Ohio.

Sarah Brown, wife of Christopher Hussey, was received at Fairfield Meeting, Ohio with children Sarah, Stephen, Mary, Priscilla, William and John at her request. She died 4-14-1814 and was buried at Clear Creek, Ohio.

WILLIAM HUSSEY was born at Clear Creek, Ohio 2-28-1802. On 5-17-1825 he was granted a certificate to marry Jane Edwards. The certificate was sent to Caesar's Creek On 6-1-1826 William Hussey, son of Christopher Hussey and Sarah of Highland County, Ohio, was married at Caesar's Creek Meeting House to Jane Edwards, daughter of William and Jamina Edwards of Clinton County, Ohio.

Jane Edwards, wife of William Hussey, was received on certificate from Caesar's Creek Meeting on 1-13-1827 at Clear Creek Monthly Meeting. On 2-13-1848, she and children, John Milton, Martha A., Lydia, Alfred, Rachel, William Henry, Esther N. and Jane were granted certificate to Union Meeting, Ohio.
