In Court Records of Knox Co., KY (Flossie doesn't give Book, or page #) On 20 Aug 1810, John Cox appointed Samuel Cox his attorney to sell a tract of land in Virginia. Alt; Nathan Cox, Richard Cox (From Wanda Kaucher, The Researcher's Guide To American Genealogy by Val D. Greenwood. 1973, Genealogical Pub. Co., Balt. page 293, 1810

"Know all men by these presents that I John Cox, of Knox County and state of Kentucky have made ordained constituted & appointed, and by these presents do make ordain Constitute & appoint Samuel Cox Junr my true & Lawful attorney, for me & in my name, but for my use to do perform & Transact all my Business in the State of Virginia To make a deed of Conveyance To a Certain tract of Land Lying in Grayson County in the State of Virginia it being the Same which Robert Still Sold as agent for me To a Certain William Byers, To Collect all money or Moneys which maybe due me and to Transact any other Business Which may be Necessary for my welfare and Well Standing in the Said State of Virginia and what ever Lawful act my said attorney may do or Cause to be done for me and in My Name I do by these presents ratify and Confirm, in witness where of I have here unto set my hand and affixed my seal .this 28th day of August 1810."

Samuel Cox sold land in County of Wythe, State of Virginia for \$500 to John Wisprian (150 acres). Also names tract of land in County of Grayson on waters of Fox River.

This last deed transaction gives us the area of Grayson Co., VA where Samuel lived.

We were probably looking too early to find land transactions in Grayson Co., VA. The Cox family had been in Knox for several years and still holding land in Grayson Co., VA.
