

OUR PERKINS ANCESTORS

- RESEARCH OF ANCIENT MANUSCRIPTS, WHICH INCLUDE THE DOME- DAY BOOK ORDERED BY DUKE WILLIAM OF NORMANDY (THE CONQUEROR) IN 1086 A.D., THE RAGMAN ROLLS OF 1291-1296 A.D., AUTHORIZED BY KING EDWARD I OF ENGLAND, THE CURIA REGIS ROLLS, THE PIPE ROLLS, AND THE HEARTH ROLLS OF ENGLAND, FOUND THE FIRST RECORD OF THE NAME PERKINS IN LEICESTERSHIRE, ENGLAND. THE NAME PERKINS, IN ONE FORM OR ANOTHER (I.E.: DE MORELY/MORELY) FIRST APPEARS ON THE CENSUS ROLLS TAKE BY THE ORDER OF THE KINGS OF ENGLAND. (J.F.P.)
 - BY THE 14TH CENTURY THE FAMILY NAME PERKINS EMERGED AS A NOTABLE ENGLISH FAMILY IN THE COUNTY OF LEICESTER WHERE THEY WERE RECORDED AS A FAMILY OF GREAT ANTIQUITY AND SEATED AS LORDS OF THE MANOR WITH ESTATES IN THAT SHIRE. THEY BRANCHED TO LIFTON COURT IN BERKSHIRE, AND SUTTON COLDFIELD IN WARWICKSHIRE.
 - SURNAMENAMES WERE NOT COMMON BEFORE THE 13TH CENTURY IN ENGLAND THOUGH THEY WERE USED OCCASIONALLY. DURING THE FIRST THREE CENTURIES AFTER THE CONQUEST PEOPLE GRADUALLY BEGAN TO ASSUME SOME SURNAME. BROTHERS WOULD OFTEN ASSUME DIFFERENT SURNAMES, HENCE IT IS DIFFICULT TO TRACE THE PEDIGREE OF ANY FAMILY BEYOND THE 13TH CENTURY. THE MINGLING OF NOR- MAN WITH ENGLISH NAMES CREATED CHAOS. MANY CALLINGS, PLACES, NICKNAMES, WERE BEING TRANSLATED INTO FRENCH AND THEN ANGLICIZED, WHILE OTHERS WERE LATINIZED, WHILE OTHERS WERE LAT- INIZED (ENCYCLOPEDIA).
 - AT THIS POINT WE PICK UP THE STORY OF OUR ANCESTOR, PETER MORLEY (MORLAIX) ALIAS PERKINS. THE LAST GENERATION TO USE THE SPELLING MORLAIX IN OR AROUND 1331 A.D. WAS THE FAMILY OF PIERRE DE MORLAIX OF SHROPSHIRE, ENGLAND. HE APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN BORN IN 1320 IN BRETAGNE, MORLAIX, NORMANDY, FRANCE. HE DIED ABOUT 1384 IN SHROPSHIRE, ENGLAND. AS SAID BEFORE, DURING THIS TIME PERIOD SURNAMES WERE NOT IN COMMON USE. NEARLY EVERYBODY WAS KNOWN BY SOME PERSONAL CHARACTERISTIC, OR BY WHAT THEY DID, OR WHO THEIR FATHER WAS, OR WHERE THEY CAME FROM; HENCE, PIERRE DE MORLAIX, WHO WAS FROM MORLAIX, FRANCE.
 - ATTAINING A HIGH POSITION IN ENGLISH SOCIETY, PIERRE BECAME THE HIGH STEWARD OF THE HUGO DE SPENCER ESTATES OF OXFORD- HIRE, ENGLAND. (PRINCESS DIANA WAS DESCENDED FROM THE DE- SPENCER FAMILY)
 - PIERRE CHANGED HIS NAME TO THE ENGLISH TRANSLATED VERSION, "PETER MORLEY," ABOUT THE TIME OF CHARLES V, THE BLACK PRINCE

OF FRANCE, RENEWED THE HUNDRED YEAR WAR WITH ENGLAND. THIS WAR WAS DISRUPTING ENGLISH SHIPPING, COMPROMISING TRADE WITH SPAIN AND THE NETHERLANDS, AND PERSECUTING ENGLISH SUBJECTS IN THE MAINLAND IN MANY WAYS. PIERRE DE MORLAIX, POSSIBLY TO CONCEAL HIS FRENCH ORIGIN, CHANGED HIS NAME TO PETER MORLEY. (JAMES FULTON PERKINS)

- PIERRE DE MORLEY, OR PETER MORLEY ALIAS PERKINS, OF SHROPSHIRE, ENGLAND, IS SAID TO BE, ACCORDING TO WORLD FAMILY TREE, VOLUME 37, TREE 1064, WAS SON OF... (NO EVIDENCE GIVEN)

- PIERRE DE DREUX, PRINCE OF BRETAGNE, WHO WAS BORN IN 1272 IN RENNES, IEV, FRANCE. HIS PARENTS WERE...

- JEAN II, DUKE OF BRETAGNE, WHO WAS BORN IN 1272 IN RENNES, IEV, FRANCE. HE MARRIED PRINCESS BEATRICE OF ENGLAND, 22 JANUARY 1258/9; (DAUGHTER OF HENRY III, KING OF ENGLAND, BORN 1 OCTOBER 1207 AT WINCHESTER; DIED 16 NOVEMBER 1272, AT WINCHESTER, AND ELEANOR OF PROVENCE, BORN 1217, DIED 24/25 JUNE 1291 AT AMESBURY. ELEANOR OF PROVENCE WAS A DAUGHTER OF RAYMOND BERENGER I, COUNT OF PROVENCE. KING HENRY III WAS SON OF JOHN "LACKLAND", KING OF ENGLAND, AND ISABELLA OF ANGOULEME). JEAN II'S PARENTS WERE...

- JEAN DE DREUX, WHO DIED IN 1286, AND BLANCHE OF NAVARRE. HIS PARENTS WERE...

- PIERRE DE DREUX I ("MAUCLERC"), COUNT OF BRITTANY. HE WAS BORN 1187, AND DIED 22 JUNE 1250. HE MARRIED ALIX DE THOUARS, DUCHESS OF BRITTANY, 1213; DAUGHTER OF GUI DE THOUARS, COUNT OF BRITTANY AND EARL OF RICHMOND, AND MARGARET OF HUNTINGDON, DAUGHTER OF HENRY DE HUNTINGDON, SON OF DAVID I, KING OF SCOTS, AND MAUDE OF HUNTINGDON. MARGARET DE HUNTINGDON'S MOTHER WAS ADA DE WARRENNE, DAUGHTER OF WILLIAM DE WARRENNE AND ISABELLE DE VERMANDOIS. PIERRE'S PARENTS WERE...

- ROBERT II, COUNT OF DREUX AND BRAINE (WHO WAS BORN 1154, AND DIED 20 DECEMBER 1218), AND YOLANDE DE COUCY, WHO DIED 18 MARCH 1222; DAUGHTER OF RAOUL DE COUCY, KILLED AT ACRE 1191 IN THE THIRD CRUSADE, SEIGNEUR OF COUCY AND MARLE, BY HIS WIFE AGNES (DIED 1174), DAUGHTER OF BALDWIN IX, COUNT OF HAINAUT, BY HIS WIFE ALICE OF NAMUR, DAUGHTER OF GODFREY, COUNT OF NAMUR (DIED 1139), AND ERMASINDE (DIED 1143), DAUGHTER OF CONRAD I (DIED 1086), COUNT OF LUXEMBOURG, SON OF ALBERT III, COUNT OF NAMUR (DIED 1102), AND IDA OF SAXONY. ROBERT II'S PARENTS WERE...

- ROBERT I, COUNT OF DREUX, BORN CIRCA 1128; DIED 1188; MARRIED (3) 1152, AGNES DE VANDEMONT, DAUGHTER OF GUY VANDEMONT. ROBERT I'S PARENTS WERE...

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- LOUIS VI, KING OF FRANCE, AND ADELAIDE OF SAVOY, DAUGHTER HUMBERT II (DIED 1103), COUNT OF MAURIENNE AND SAVOY, BY HIS WIFE GISELE OF BURGUNDY, DAUGHTER OF WILLIAM I, COUNT OF BURGUNDY, BY HIS WIFE STEPHANIE. LOUIS VI WAS SON OF...
- PHILIP I, KING OF FRANCE, BORN 1053; DIED IN MEULAN 28 JULY 1108; BURIED AT ABBAYE ST. BENOIT-SUR-LOIRE. HE MARRIED BERTHA OF HOLLAND, BORN CIRCA 1055; DIED EARLY 1094 AT MONTREUIL-SUR-MER; DAUGHTER OF FLORENT I, COUNT OF HOLLAND, AND HIS WIFE GERTRUDE, DAUGHTER OF BERNARD II, DUKE OF SAXONY. PARENTS OF PHILIP I WERE...
- HENRY I, KING OF FRANCE; BORN 1006; DIED 4 AUGUST 1060. HE MARRIED ANNE OF KIEV (DIED AFTER 1075), DAUGHTER OF JEROSLAV I, GRAND PRINCE OF KIEV (DIED 20 FEBRUARY 1053/4; MARRIED (2) 1019, INGEBURG (DIED 10 FEBRUARY 1050), DAUGHTER OF OLAF SKOTKONUNG, KING OF SWEDEN (DIED 1020), SON OF ERIC SEGERSALL, KING OF SWEDEN (DIED CIRCA 994), AND SIGRID (SIGRITH) STORRADA, DAUGHTER OF SKOGLARTOSTI. JEROSLAV I WAS SON OF ST. VLADIMIR, GRAND PRINCE OF KIEV, WHO DIED 15 JULY 1015, AND ROGNEIDE, DAUGHTER OF ROGNALD, ST. VLADIMIR'S PARENTS WERE SVATISLAV I, GRAND PRINCE OF KIEV (DIED 973), AND MALOUCHA. HIS PARENTS WERE IGOR, GRAND PRINCE OF KIEV (DIED 947), MARRIED 903 ST. OLGA (DIED 969). HIS FATHER WAS RURIK, PROBABLY A VIKING, GRAND PRINCE OF KIEV (DIED 899). HENRY I'S PARENTS WERE...
- ROBERT II ("THE PIOUS"), KING OF FRANCE; BORN IN ORLEANS 985; DIED MEULAN 20 JULY 1031; MARRIED (3) 1061/2 CONSTANCE OF PROVENCE, DAUGHTER OF WILLIAM, COUNT OF PROVENCE, AND ADELAIDE OF ANJOU, DAUGHTER OF FULK II. ROBERT II'S PARENTS WERE...
- HUGH CAPE, COUNT OF PARIS, KING OF FRANCE (BORN AFTER 939; DIED 24 OCTOBER 996) (FIRST OF THE CAPETIAN KINGS). HE MARRIED ADELAIDE OF POITOU. HIS PARENTS WERE...
- HUGH MAGNUS, COUNT OF PARIS, AND (3) HEDWIG, DAUGHTER OF HENRY I ("THE FOWLER"), KING OF SAXON. THE PARENTS OF HUGH MAGNUS WERE...
- ROBERT I, DUKE OF FRANCE, CHOSEN KING IN 922; HE DIED 15 JUNE 923; MARRIED (2) BEATRIX DE VERMANDOIS, DAUGHTER OF HERBERT I, COUNT OF VERMANDOIS. PARENTS OF ROBERT I WERE...
- RUTPERT IV, COUNT OF WORMGAU, BLOIS, TOURS, AUXERE, AND NEVERS; KILLED 15 SEPTEMBER 866. CALLED "ROBERT THE STRONG". HE MARRIED (2) AELIS (OR ADELAIDE) OF TOURS AND ALSACE, BORN 819; DIED CIRCA 866, DAUGHTER OF HUGH, COUNT OF TOURS, BY HIS WIFE BAVA. RUTPERT WAS SON OF...
- RUTPERT III, COUNT OF WORMGAU; DIED 834; MARRIED WIALDRUTH,

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DAUGHTER OF ST. WILLIAM, COUNT OF TOULOUSE. RUTPERT III'S PARENTS WERE...

- RUTPERT II, COUNT IN THE UPPER RHINE AND WORMGAU; MARRIED (1) THEODERATA. HIS FATHER WAS...
 - TURINGBERTUS (THURINGBURD). HIS PARENTS WERE...
 - RUTPERT I, COUNT IN THE UPPER RHINE AND WORMGAU; MARRIED WILLISWINT, DAUGHTER OF COUNT ADELHELM. RUTPERT I WAS SON OF...
 - LANTBERTUS (LAMBERT) II; DEAD IN 741.
- HENRY PERKINS, SON OF PIERRE DE MORLAIX WAS BORN ABOUT 1345. IN THE DOCUMENTS OF THE TIME HE WAS CALLED HENRY PIERREKINS, OR HENRY SON OF PIERRE. HE HELD THE POSITION OF HIGH STEWARD TO THE DESPENCERS FOR MANY YEARS. AMONG OTHER CHILDREN HE HAD...

- JOHN PERKINS, ARMINER (A PERSON ENTITLED TO HERALDIC ARTS). HE SUCCEEDED HIS FATHER AS HIGH STEWARD, AND IS SPOKEN OF AS A SENESCHALLUS OF WARWICK CASTLE (AN OFFICIAL IN CHARGE OF DOMESTIC ARRANGEMENTS AND THE ADMINISTRATION OF SERVANTS IN A MEDIEVAL NOBLE HOUSEHOLD). HIS NAME OFTEN APPEARED IN THE BUSINESS MATTERS WHICH PASSED UNDER HIS EYES. JOHN WAS BORN ABOUT 1370, AND DIED AFTER 1399 IN MADRESFIELD. HIS SON WAS...

- WILLIAM PERKINS. HE WAS BORN ABOUT 1390. HE WAS FIRST OWNER OF UPTON COURT ESTATE. A MANOR HOUSE IS STILL STANDING IN BERKSHIRE NEARING READING, ABOUT TWO MILES FROM THE VILLAGE OF UPTON NERVET. (IN 1977 THE MANOR WAS USED BY THE BERKSHIRE SCHOOLS AS AN OUTDOOR AND HISTORICAL CENTER - VERY NICELY MAINTAINED. NOT IN THE PERKINS FAMILY SINCE 1750.) AS BAILIFF FOR ABINGDON HE CALLED FOR CONFISCATION OF CHURCH LANDS, BECAME AN ENEMY OF THE DUKE OF GLOUCESTER, AND WAS ARRESTED BY WILLIAM WARBLETON AT OXFORD, AND WAS DRAWN AND QUARTERED, ALONG WITH FIVE OTHERS, FOR HERESY. (JAMES FULTON PERKINS)

WILLIAM WAS LORD OF UPTON, AND ALSO AGENT TO HUMPHREY PLAGENET, DUKE OF GLOUCESTER, WHO WAS THE BROTHER OF HENRY II. IN 1427, AND DURING SEVERAL SUCCEEDING YEARS, WILLIAM PERKINS SERVED AS ESCHEATOR (HAS TO DO WITH THE REVERSION OF PROPERTY) FOR THE COUNTIES OF BERKS AND OXON. HE ALSO TOOK PART IN THE ECCLESIASTICAL UNION OF THE TWO PARISHES OF UPTON ROBERT AND UPTON RICHARD OR NERVET IN 1435. HE MARRIED MARGARET ABOUT 1420. HE DIED ABOUT 1451. THEIR SON WAS...

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- THOMAS PERKINS, WHO WAS BORN ABOUT 1420, AND DIED BEFORE 1479 IN UFTON PARISH, ENGLAND. HE WAS OF UFTON AND MADRESFIELD IN WORCESTERSHIRE. HE INHERITED HIS FATHER'S MANDOR OF UFTON ROBERT. AMONG OTHER CHILDREN, HE HAD...
- WILLIAM PERKINS, WHO WAS BORN ABOUT 1450 IN UFTON PARISH. HE DIED AFTER 1495. AMONG OTHER CHILDREN, HE HAD A SON...
- THOMAS PERKINS, WHO WAS BORN ABOUT 1475 IN UFTON PARISH, AND DIED 21 JUNE 1528 IN HILLMORTON, WARWICKSHIRE, ENGLAND. HE MARRIED ALYS (ALICE) DE ASTLEY ABOUT 1500 IN HILLMORTON. SHE WAS BORN ABOUT 1475 IN UFTON PARISH, AND DIED 15 DECEMBER 1538 IN HILLMORTON.

WILL OF THOMAS PERKINS (SON OF WILLIAM)

- HIS WILL WAS MADE ON 3 APRIL 1528 AND IT WAS PROVED 21 APRIL 1528.
- HE DIRECTED THAT HE BE BURIED IN THE CHURCH OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST "BEFORE THE ROOD", AND THAT HIS MORTUARY BE AS THE CUSTOM AND MANNER WAS. TO THE HIGH ALTAR, 8d, TO THE MOTHER CHURCHES OF COVENTRY AND LICHFIELD, 4d, EACH. TO THE PARISH CHURCH OF HILLMORTON, 6 S. 8d. TO HIS WIFE ALICE, ALL HIS LANDS AND TENEMENTS IN THE TOWNS OF FYLDS, HILLMORTON, AND LYLBORNE (COUNTY OF NORTHAMPTON), AS LONG AS SHE CONTINUETH IN WIDOWHOOD. IF SHE MARRY, HENRY, MY SON, SHALL HAVE THE SAID LANDS AND TENEMENTS, BUT IF HE DIE WITHOUT LAWFUL ISSUE, THEY SHALL REMAIN TO JONE AND JEL-YAN, HIS DAUGHTERS, AND THEIR HEIRS. IF THEY DIE WITHOUT ISSUE, THE TAIL LANDS AND TENEMENTS SHALL REMAIN TO THE NEXT HEIRS. AND THE FEE SIMPLE LANDS AND TENEMENTS TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF HILLMORTON FOREVER, TO THE BEST USE THAT CAN BE PROVIDED FOR THE PLEASURE OF GOD AND FOR THE HEALTH OF HIS SOUL AND ALL CHRISTIAN SOULS. RESIDUE TO HIS WIFE ALICE AND THOMAS CLERKE, EXECUTORS. SUPERVISORS: GEORGE SALE AND RICHARD SMITH, TO WHOM 40 S. BETWEEN THEM FOR THEIR LABORS. WITNESSES: SIR JOHN GRENDDON, VICAR OF HILLMORTON, SIR SIR JOHN STOKS, SIR THOMAS BOLLAND, WILLIAM BAYLE, RICHARD HORNE, JOHN CUMPTON, ROGER JONES, AND OTHERS, ETC... (LICH-FIELD REGISTRY).

WILL OF ALICE (DEASTLEY) PERKINS

- THE WILL OF ALICE PERKINS OF HILLMORTON, WIDOW, WAS DATED 31 JULY 1538 AND PROVED 15 OCTOBER 1538. SHE ASKED THAT SHE BE BURIED IN THE CHURCH OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST.
- TO JEYN (JONE) SLEYTER, HER DAUGHTER, TO JULIANA (JELYAN)

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CUMPTON, HER DAUGHTER. TO HENRY PERKINS, HER SON AND EXECUTOR. SUPERVISORS: JOHN STOKYS, CLERK, THOMAS CLERK, GEORGE DOBBE, WILLIAM FREMAN, THOMAS DUNKELE, RICHARD BASSETT. (LICHFIELD REGISTER)

DE ASTLEY

(FROM BURKE'S "DORMANT & EXTINCT PEERAGES")

- THIS NOBLE FAMILY DERIVED ITS SURNAME FROM THE MANOR OF ASTLEY (OR ESTLEY, AS FORMERLY WRITTEN) IN THE COUNTY OF WARWICK WHICH, WITH OTHER ESTATES IN THAT SHIRE, BELONGED TO THE ASTLEYS AS FAR BACK AS THE REIGN OF HENRY I (1100-1136).
- PHILIP DE ASTLEY, GRANDSON OF THE FIRST POSSESSOR, WAS CERTIFIED UPON THE ASSESSMENT OF THE AID TOWARDS THE MARRIAGE PORTION OF KING HENRY III'S FECS OF WILLIAM, EARL OF WARWICK, DEVETERI FEODFAMENIO BY THE SERVICE "OF LAYING HANDS ON THE EARL'S STIRROP WHEN HE DID GET UPON, OR ALIGHT FROM HORSEBACK". THIS FEUDAL BARON WAS SUCCEEDED BY HIS SON...
- THOMAS DE ASTLEY, WHO, HOLDING CERTAIN LANDS OF THE HONOR OF LEICESTER, BECAME A KIND OF BAILIFF TO SIMON DE MONTFORT, EARL OF LEICESTERSHIRE. "AS MAY BE SEEN"; SAYS DUGDALE, "BY A FINE OF FOUR SCORE MARKS AND A PALFREY, TO THE KING IN 9TH JOHN, TO BE DISCHARGED OF THE PROFITS REQUIRED OF HIM FOR THAT EARL'S LANDS DURING THE TIME HE HAD TO DO WITH THEM." (BAILIFF = AGENT APPOINTED BY LORDS WITH IMPORTANT FUNCTIONS - SUCH AS AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE, PROCESS, AND MAKE ARRESTS IN THEIR RESPECTIVE JURISDICTIONS.)
- IN THE 12TH OF KING JOHN, THIS THOMAS DE ASTLEY PAID 100 MARKS TO THE CROWN TO BE EXCUSED FROM GOING BEYOND THE SEA. DUGDALE SUPPOSES IN AN EXPEDITION TO IRELAND. IN THE 17TH OF THE SAME REIGN HE WAS COMMITTED PRISONER TO REDFORD CASTLE, AND HAD HIS LANDS SEIZED FOR HIS PARTICIPATION IN THE REBELLION OF THE BARONS; BUT, RETURNING TO HIS ALLEGIANCE, HE WAS REINSTATED IN HIS TERRITORIAL POSSESSIONS IN THE FIRST YEAR OF HENRY III, AND IN TWO YEARS AFTERWARDS HE WAS CONSTITUTED COMMISSIONER FOR RESTORING TO THE CROWN ALL THE DESMESNES OF WHICH KING JOHN WAS POSSESSED AT THE BEGINNING OF HIS WARS WITH THE BARONS, ETC.. THIS FEUDAL LORD MARRIED MAUDE, ONE OF THE SISTERS OF ROGER DE CAMVILLE OF CRECKE, COUNTY NORTHAMPTON. MAUDE WAS A DAUGHTER OF WALTER DE CAMVILLE, SON OF RICHARD DE CAMVILLE, SON OF GERARD DE CAMVILLE (BURKE'S DORMANT & EXTINCT PEERAGES; WORLD FAMILY TREE, VOLUME 14, TREE 3302). THOMAS DE ASTLEY WAS SUC-

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~~HE~~ SUCCEEDED BY HIS SON..

- WALTER DE ASTLEY. THIS NOBLEMAN HAD BEEN CONCERNED IN THE REBELLION OF THE BARONS AGAINST JOHN. HE WAS SUCCEEDED BY HIS SON..

- SIR THOMAS DE ASTLEY, KNIGHT, WHO WAS CONSTITUTED IN THE 26TH OF HENRY III, ONE OF THE KING'S JUSTICES FOR THE JAIL DELIVERY AT WARWICK, AND AGAIN IN THE NEXT YEAR, WHEN HE PAID TO THE KING £15 FOR HIS RELIEF. IN THE 32ND OF HENRY III, THIS THOMAS DE ASTLEY WAS SENT WITH SEVERAL OTHER PERSONS OF RANK AND POWER TO GASCOIGNE: BUT AFTERWARDS WE FIND HIM, IN THE 47TH HENRY III, A LEADER AMONG THE REBELLIOUS BARONS WHO SEIZED UPON THE REVENUES OF THE CROWN IN THE COUNTIES OF WARWICK AND LEICESTER; AND WHEN THE KING SUBMITTED TO THE PROVISIONS OF OXFORD THE FOLLOWING YEAR HE WAS NOMINATED CUSTOS PACIS FOR LEICESTERSHIRE. SIR THOMAS FELL, HOWEVER, SOON AFTER (49TH HENRY III - 1264) WITH MONTFORT, EARL OF LEICESTERSHIRE, AND OTHER INSURRECTIONARY NOBLES AT THE BATTLE OF EYESHAM. WHEN HIS ESTATES, WHICH WERE VALUED AT £151-165-18d PER ANNUM, BEING CONFISCATED, WERE CONFERRED UPON WARINE DE BASSINGBOURNE. HE MARRIED SECONDLY, EDITHA, DAUGHTER OF PETER CONSTABLE, ESQUIRE, OF MELTON CONSTABLE IN NORFOLK, AND SISTER OF SIR RALPH CONSTABLE, KNIGHT. SIR THOMAS AND EDITHA CONSTABLE HAD THREE SONS AND A DAUGHTER.

- IN ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST CHURCH AT HILLMORTON PARISH IN THE SIDE AISLE, ON THE RIGHT, FACING THE ALTAR, ARE LIFE-SIZED EFFIGIES OF THOMAS AND EDITHA (CONSTABLE) DE ASTLEY, WHO LIVED IN THE 14TH CENTURY. ACCORDING TO THE VICAR OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST CHURCH, THEY ARE THE FOREBEARERS OF ALICE DE ASTLEY, WHO IS SAID TO HAVE MARRIED THOMAS PERKINS (1475-1528), WHOSE WILL DIRECTED THAT HE BE BURIED IN THE CHURCH OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST "BEFORE THE ROOD" (CROSS). AN OLD INSCRIPTION OF THE CHURCH STATES... "IN THE MIDDLE AISLE OF THIS CHURCH ARE TWO GRAVESTONES OF MARBLE, EACH OF

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THEM HAVING SMALL PORTRAITURES IN BRASS OF A MAN AND A WOMAN WITH DIVERS CHILDREN; ON ONE OF THEM IS THIS INSCRIPTION: "HERE LYETH THOMAS PERKINS AND ALICE AND ELIZABETH. OUR LORD SAVE THEIR SOULS FROM EVERLASTING DEATH. AMEN."

- THERE IS A LARGE TIME GAP BETWEEN THOMAS AND EDITHA (CONSTABLE) DE ASTLEY AND THOMAS AND ALICE (DE ASTLEY) PERKINS. THOMAS AND ALICE (DE ASTLEY) PERKINS SON WAS...
- HENRY PERKINS. HENRY WAS BORN ABOUT 1500 IN HILLMORTON, WAR-WICKSHIRE. HE DIED IN 1546 IN HILLMORTON. HE MADE A WILL, WHICH IS NOW MISSING, BUT ON THE 16TH OF JUNE 1546 IT WAS PROVED BY SIMON CLARE, THOMAS CUMPTON, AND RICHARD BAYLE, THE EXECUTORS. HE BEING NAMED HENRY PERKINS, LATE OF PARISH OF HILLMORTON, DECEASED. IT IS STATED IN AN ABSTRACT MADE IN OR BEFORE 1894 THAT THOMAS PERKINS THE SON, IS MENTIONED. BUT IN A RECENT ABSTRACT THIS DOES NOT APPEAR. HIS ELDEST SON WAS...
- THOMAS PERKINS, SR. THIS THOMAS WAS A PROSPEROUS YEOMAN FARMER. HE WAS BORN ABOUT 1525 IN HILLMORTON. HE LEFT A LEGACY IN HIS WILL TO HIS "BROTHER KEBBLE'S WIFE". HIS WIFE, ALICE MAY HAVE BEEN ALICE KEBBLE, BUT THERE ARE OTHER POSSIBILITIES. FOUR KEBBLE WILLS OF THE PERIOD AND LOCALITY HAVE BEEN EXTRACTED WITHOUT IDENTIFYING HER. THOMAS PERKINS, SR. MARRIED ALICE ABOUT 1555 IN HILLMORTON. HE DIED IN 1592 IN HILLMORTON, AND WAS BURIED 23 MARCH 1592; AND AN ALICE PERKINS WAS BURIED 20 AUGUST 1613. (THE HILLMORTON PARISH RECORD BEGINS IN 1564)

- WILL OF THOMAS PERKINS (SON OF HENRY)

THE WILL OF THOMAS PERKINS, THE ELDER, OF HILLMORTON, WAS MADE IN SEPTEMBER 1588, AND PROVED 11 MAY 1592. HE ASKED TO BE BURIED IN THE PARISH CHURCH OR CHURCHYARD, AND GAVE FOR RELIEF OF THE POOR OF HILLMORTON 10 S.; TO EVERY GOD-CHILD, 6 d.. TO HIS SON JOHN AND HIS HEIRS MALE, HIS HOUSE, MESSAGE (A DWELLING HOUSE WITH ITS OUT BUILDINGS AND ADJOINING LANDS) OR TENEMENT IN HILLMORTON LATE IN THE TENURE OF THOMAS BASSETT, WITH AN ORCHARD, A CLOSE, ONE BACKSIDE OF THE TENEMENT AND ONE-HALF YARD OF ARABLE LAND WITH MEADOWS, PASTURES AND COMMONS THERETO BELONGING, WITH SUCCESSIVE REMAINDERS TO HIS SONS EDWARD AND HIS HEIRS MALE, HIS SON LUKE AND HIS HEIRS MALE, AND FINAL REMAINDER TO HIS OWN RIGHT HEIRS. TO HIS ELDEST SON HENRY PERKINS ALL THE RESIDUE OF HIS HOUSES, LANDS, TENEMENTS, AND HEREDITAMENTS. TO ALICE

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"NOW MY WIFE", ALL HIS HOUSEHOLD STUFF, FURNITURE IN THE PARLOR OR CHAMBER WHERE WE USED TO LIE (ONE COFFER WITH HIS EVIDENCES EXCEPTED) AND THE USE OF THE SAID CHAMBER DURING WIDOWHOOD. TO HIS SON WILLIAM PERKINS 10 S.. TO HIS SON THOMAS PERKINS 10 S.. TO HIS SON EDWARD PERKINS £40 FOUR YEARS AFTER HIS DEATH. TO HIS SON LUKE PERKINS £40 SIX YEARS AFTER HIS DEATH. TO HIS SON ISACHE PERKINS £40 TEN YEARS AFTER HIS DEATH. TO EVERYONE OF HIS SONS' CHILDREN A EWES AND A LAMB. TO THOMAS KEBBLE A LAMB. TO HIS BROTHER WILLIAM PERKINS A EWES AND A LAMB. RESIDUE TO HIS SON HENRY PERKINS, SOLE EXECUTOR. WITNESSES: EDWARD THOMSON, EDWARD HERES, THOMAS BOTTRE, NICHOLAS DUELL, WILLIAM KEEBLE, THOMAS HERES. THE INVENTORY WAS IN THE SUM OF £192. 10 S., AND WAS TAKEN 29 MARCH 1592 BY EDWARD CUMPTON, RICHARD SMYTH, AND THOMAS GARFIELD (LICHFIELD REGISTER).

- ISAAC PERKINS II WAS BAPTISED 26 JANUARY 1611/12 IN HILLMORTON PARISH. THE RECORD OF HIS BAPTISM APPEARS IN THE REGISTER OF THE CHURCH OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST. (THE MARRIAGE OF HIS UNCLE

(OUR PERKINS ANCESTORS - PG. 10)

JOHN OF IPSWICH IS ALSO RECORDED THERE).

- ISAAC PERKINS II CAME TO NEW ENGLAND BETWEEN 1630 AND 1634. HE WAS IN IPSWICH IN 1637 AS HE RECEIVED A GRANT OF LAND THERE AT THAT TIME. IN 1638 THE TOWN OF HAMPTON, NEW HAMPSHIRE, WAS SETTLED, AND AMONG THOSE WHO WENT THERE WERE ABRAHAM PERKINS (ISAAC'S HALF-BROTHER) AND ISAAC II, AND THEIR FAMILIES. THEY APPEAR TO HAVE MADE SETTLEMENT ABOUT THE SAME TIME, AND THE HOUSE LOTS ASSIGNED TO THEM BY THE TOWN, EACH CONTAINING FIVE ACRES, AND ADJOINED EACH OTHER. - IN JUNE 1652, REVEREND TIMOTHY DALTON (WHO GOT REV. STEPHEN BACHILER EX COMMUNICATED) SOLD HIS FARM IN SAYBROOK, NEW HAMPSHIRE, TO ISAAC II, WHO AT THAT TIME WAS A PLANTER.. HE PROBABLY MOVED THERE SOON AFTER THE PURCHASE.
- A NOTE ON THE FAMILIES IN HAMPTON STATES THAT DURING THE FIRST SUMMER MR. BACHILER WAS IN HAMPTON, THE FAMILIES OF ABRAHAM AND ISAAC PERKINS WERE AMONG THE NUMBER THERE. - ISAAC PERKINS II WAS A RICH MAN: HE WAS A SHIP'S CARPENTER, AND SETTLED IT WHAT IS NOW SEABROOK. ISAAC MARRIED SUSANNAH IN 1634. SUSANNAH SURVIVED HER HUSBAND, AND DIED A WIDOW IN NEWCASTLE, DELAWARE, WHERE SHE WAS LIVING WITH HER DAUGHTER REBECCA, AND REBECCA'S HUSBAND, JOHN HUSSEY I, SON OF CAPTAIN CHRISTOPHER HUSSEY AND THEODATE BACHILER, DAUGHTER OF REVEREND STEPHEN BACHILER AND ANN BATE. (HIS FIRST WIFE) (VOL. II "GENEALOGICAL AND FAMILY HISTORY OF THE STATE OF MAINE" BY GEORGE T. LITTLE)
- NEITHER WILL NOR SETTLEMENT OF ISAAC'S ESTATE HAS BEEN FOUND. HE WAS A CONSTABLE IN 1650, AND SERVED ON THE JURY OFTEN. HE DEEDED TO HIS SON EBENEZER IN 1680. EBENEZER SOLD, WITH HIS MOTHER'S PERMISSION, THE HOMESTEAD, AND HE AND HIS MOTHER, ACCOMPANIED BY OTHER CHILDREN, MOVED TO DELAWARE. THE SAME YEAR HER ESTATE WAS SETTLED BY HER SON-IN-LAW, JOHN HUSSEY I.
